PETITION

"To The Honorable Mayor and City Council,  
Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned, property owners in the Original Town Site and Winn's Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, respectfully request the Honorable Mayor and City Council to take all necessary steps and appropriate action to prohibit the erection and operation of a planing mill in our residential section of the City of Idaho Falls.

We are satisfied that there is ample room and available sites near our City for such industrial enterprises where their operation will not disturb the quiet of our citizens and depreciate the value of their homes.

We feel that to take action to remove a planing mill from one ward of the City and then permit the owner thereof to erect and operate it in another ward, is clearly an injustice and an unfair act of discrimination on the part of the City authorities in favor of the citizens of one section against those of another section of the City."

It was moved by Evans, seconded by Sutton, that the petition be referred to the City Attorney for his legal opinion, as to what action, if any, the Mayor and City Council can take in the matter.
