

JUNE 6, 1938

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held June 3rd, 1938, and recessed until June 6th, 1938.

There were present at said Meeting: Chase A. Clark, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Wing; Absent: Crabtree and Wasley; when the following applications for licenses were read:

It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Sutton, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton; Absent: Crabtree & Wasley; Motion carried.

It was moved by Mehlhoff, seconded by Evans, that the permits be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Wing, Fanning; Absent: Wasley and Sutton; Motion carried.

An Ordinance entitled: "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1938-1939 AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Sutton, that the Ordinance be passed on its First reading. Roll call voting Aye: Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Wing; Absent: Wasley and Crabtree; Motion carried. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Wing, Fanning; Absent: Wasley, and Crabtree; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wing, that the Ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Wing, Fanning, Gourley; Absent: Wasley and Crabtree; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Wing, seconded by Fanning, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Sutton, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff; Absent: Wasley and Crabtree; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then numbered 514 and passed to the Mayor for his approval and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved, and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

The Mayor requested authority to make application with the Federal Government for P. S. A. Grant to build an addition to the Public Library at an estimated cost of \$40,000.00. Also to authorize C. A. Sundberg to draw plans for the building and if the project does go through, the City is to pay C. A. Sundberg for the plans. Roll call voting Aye: Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Wing, Fanning, Gourley; Absent: Wasley & Crabtree.; Motion carried.

C. A. Sundberg requested a building permit for a one story fire proof building to be constructed on the corner of A Street and Capitol Avenue for the Union Pacific Stage Lines. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Gourley, that the Building Inspector be authorized to issue the permit. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Sutton, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff; Absent: Wasley and Crabtree; Motion carried.

Parley Rigby appeared before the Council and requested the City to underwrite the 1938 War Bonnet Roundup to the extent of \$1,000.00. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Sutton, that the City underwrite the War Bonnet Roundup show to be held July 28th, 29th, and 30th, 1938, for the American Legion to the extent of \$1,000.00 and the City is to receive fifty percent of the net proceeds of the three day show as rental for the park. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Sutton, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff; Absent: Crabtree and Wasley; Motion carried.

Mr. Rigby stated that the bucking chutes should be made portable so that they can be moved to any location. The cost of remodeling and moving the chutes would be about \$750.00. It was

moved by Gourley, seconded by Evans, that the expense of rebuilding and moving the bucking chutes at the City Park be paid out of the first proceeds taken in at the War Bonnet Roundup. Roll

call voting Aye: Sutton, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans; Absent: Crabtree & Wasley; Motion carried.

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Sutton, that the Purchasing Agent be authorized to purchase a new automobile for the Police Department from the Browning Auto Company. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton; Absent: Crabtree and Wasley; Motion carried.

It was moved by Evans, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the Meeting recess until Thursday, June 9th, 1938. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton; Absent: Wasley and Crabtree; Motion carried.

Passed and approved this 17th day of June, 1938.
