An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 505 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, WHICH PROVIDED THAT IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY MINOR UNDER THE AGE OF SIXTEEN (16) YEARS TO BE ON THE STREETS, ALLEYS, OR ANY UNOCCUPIED PLACE AFTER NINE O'CLOCK IN THE EVENING" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then numbered 507 and passed to the Mayor for is approval, and was, by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 473 OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, AND PROHIBITING THE SALE AND SERVING OF BEER AND OTHER BEVERAGES CONTAINING ONE-HALF OF ONE PERCENT OR MORE OF ALCOHOL BY VOLUME, BETWEEN THE HOURS OF TWO A. M. AND SIX A. M. AND REGULATING THE SALE AND SERVING OF SUCH BEVERAGES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF" and read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Evans, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. The Ordinance was then numbered 508 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE NO. 431 OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, BY ADDING THERETO A SECTION DESIGNATED AS SECTION 1-a, TAKING CERTAIN PROPERTY FROM THE RESIDENCE

ZONE AND EXTENDING THE INDUSTRIAL ZONE TO INCLUDE SAID PROPERTY” was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Sutton, that the Ordinance NOVEMBER 5, 1937

be passed on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Fanning, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Fanning, Gurley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Fanning, that the Ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Gourley, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was numbered 509 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

Dear Mr. Sutton:

In compliance with your request, an inspection was made on October 29, in company with Mr. G. E. Patten, of a proposed new street entrance into the north part of the City.

The plan is to connect the south end of the Lewisville Road with a street or roadway extending in a southwesterly direction to the north end of Idaho Avenue at Whittier Street. A petition was filed with the City Clerk some two years ago, it is said, which set for the benefits to be derived by the farmers who use the Lewisville Road, as well as the advantage which would accrue to the north part of the City.

The proposed road would be approximately three-fourths of a mile in length. It would cut diagonally across Block 2 of Dwight's Addition which it leaves Idaho Avenue: thence about one-fourth mile across farm land not in the City limits; thence about three-eighths of a mile across some vacant property in the north end of the Mayflower Addition, to the north boundary of the City at the south end of the Lewisville Road. The Butte Railroad track and the switchback track would have to be crossed, but it is believed a surface crossing at this point would be satisfactory.

The actual construction of the proposed roadway would not be very difficult or expensive. However, since practically all of the road area is over private property, the first step would be to see whether any money is available from some source, and if so, negotiations for the right of way should be started.

This roadway would be of considerable advantage in that it would eliminate travel over a poor piece of road north of the Fairview Service Station and also would cut considerable traffic off the highway and subway.
