The following Resolution was read:

RESOLUTION

RESOLVED that the City of Idaho Falls shall not pay to any employee the wages earned by such employee, or to any person an account due to him from the City as long as the employee, or person, is delinquent in the payment of his water or electric light and power bills to the City; that the amount due the employee, or other person, for wages or accounts, shall first, be applied on the payment of the delinquent light and water bills and the balance, if any, paid to the employee, or person, and provided a list of all persons who are delinquent in the payment of bills for water or electricity.”

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the Resolution be adopted. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Mehlhoff; Nay: None; Absent: Mehlhoff; Motion carried.

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 505 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, WHICH PROVIDED THAT IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY MINOR UNDER THE AGE OF SIXTEEN (16) YEARS TO BE ON THE STREETS, ALLEYS, OR ANY UNOCCUPIED PLACE AFTER NINE O'CLOCK IN THE EVENING" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Mehlhoff, Wasley; Nay: None; Absent: Gourley; Motion carried.

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 473 OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, AND PROHIBITING THE SALE AND SERVING OF BEER AND OTHER BEVERAGES CONTAINING ONE-HALF OF ONE PERCENT OR MORE OF ALCOHOL BY VOLUME, BETWEEN THE HOURS OF TWO A.M. AND SIX O'CLOCK A.M., AND REGULATING THE SALE AND SERVING OF SUCH BEVERAGES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wing, that the Ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans; Nay: None; Absent: Gourley; Motion carried.

The following Resolution was read:

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable and necessary for the City of Idaho Falls to lay out and construct a street along the east bank of the Snake River upon and across Lots 3 and 5 in Block 63 of the Original Townsite of the City of Idaho Falls, and to acquire all of said Lot 3 and a portion of said Lot 5 for said purpose; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable and necessary for the City of Idaho Falls to take and acquire all that portion of Lot 5 not required for said street for the purpose of a City park for the use and benefit of the public; and

WHEREAS, said lots are owned by private parties from whom the City has sought in good faith to purchase said lots so sought to be taken and to settle with the owners thereof for the damages which might result from the taking thereof, and said City has been unable to make any reasonable bargain therefore or settlement of such damages;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Attorney be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to institute and prosecute eminent domain proceedings against the owners of said lots for the purpose of acquiring, taking and using same for the purpose of a public street or highway all of Lot 3 in Block 63 Original Townsite of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and the following described portion of Lot 5, Block 63 of the Original Townsite of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls:

Beginning at a point on the east bank of Snake River, said point being on the north line of Lot 5, Block 63, Original Townsite of the Town of Eagle

Rock, now Idaho Falls, 242.5 feet west of the northeast corner of said Lot 5, and running thence S .60 degrees 45' E. 155.85 ft., thence S. 11 degrees 13'

E. 65.8 feet to the South line of said Lot 5; thence N. 50 degrees 45' W. along the said S. line 156.5 feet to the east bank of Snake River; thence northerly along the east bank of Snake River to the point of beginning;

and said attorney is further authorized and directed to institute and prosecute eminent domain proceedings against the owner and owners of the remainder of said Lot 5 of the purpose of acquiring, taking and using said remainder of said Lot 5 for the purpose of a public park, which remainder of said Lot 5 is described as follows: to wit:

Beginning at the northeast corner of Lot 5, Block 63, Original Townsite of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho said point being also the northeast corner of Block 63, and running thence N. 60 degrees 45' W. 86.65 feet along the northerly line of said Lot 5; thence S. 11 degrees 13' E. 65.8 feet to the south line of said Lot 5; thence S. 60 degrees, 45' E. along the south line 43.95 feet to the SE corner of said Lot; thence N. 29 degrees 15' east along the east line of said Lot 50.0 feet to the point of beginning.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said land, easements and right-of-way hereinbefore described are necessary for the public use as hereinbefore set forth and are hereby appropriated and dedicated to public use, to wit: as sites for the construction of a street or highway and for the construction of a public park as respectively hereinbefore set forth for the use of the City of Idaho Falls and its inhabitants."

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Evans, that the Resolution be adopted. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton; Nay: None; Absent: Gourley; Motion carried.

The Mayor and Councilmen presented the following letter which was read by the Clerk:

"It will be necessary for you to pay up your delinquent light and water account not later than November 1st, or service will be discontinued.

There is no desire to work a hardship on you, but the City administration has decided that all delinquent accounts must be paid. We hope that this will not inconvenience you and that you will be able to take care of this account not later than the 1st of November.

If your circumstances are such that it will be inconvenient to pay the account in full by November 1st, we will accept one-half and extend the payment of the other half until the 15th day of November.

Hereafter all current bills must be paid before the 10th of the month or service will be discontinued.
