Idaho Falls, Idaho
August 30, 1937

Honorable Mayor and City Council
Attention: Mr. T. R. Peters

Gentlemen,

About the first of the year water users and businessmen of Idaho Falls met and elected a Water Committee for furthering the cause of the South Fork Reservoir and any other water questions that might come up, and to send a delegation to Boise to sit in the Regional Planning Board meeting. This was done, and I might say that we think a great deal of good has come from that contact, as we received a letter from Mr. Paige, Commissioner, U. S. Bureau of Reclamation, Washington, D. C. stating that he was using every effort to get appropriation for surveying the reservoir sites and that this work would be done this year he thought.

At that time the County and City were asked to contribute \$100.00 each, to this fund. Both agreed and I think your minutes will bear me out. We have the County's share and this money was expended. We now have a request to attend a hearing at Boise by the Army Engineers and the Department of Agriculture on September 8, relative to Flood Control and Supplemental Water. Copy of hearing attached.

We feel that a great deal of good may come out of such a meeting in furthering our cause for the Reservoir on the South Fork to prevent floods and store supplemental water. We have asked Mr. Lynn Crandall to prepare a proposal which he gladly did. Enclosed is a copy of the proposal.

We want to call an informal meeting including your City Engineer, Mr. Black, Chamber of Commerce and the canal heads and see if they would like to add or detract any of Mr. Crandall's statements.

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We understand the Council meets on the 3rd and this new body may again want to pass on the merits of this appropriation which we trust will be favorable. Therefore, we would be pleased to have your check by the 7th of September to take care of two delegates to the meeting.

Councilman Gourley stated that parking lights should be installed on Memorial Drive for the protection of people who park their cars there while they are shopping. It was moved by Mehlhoff, seconded by Sutton, that street parking lights be installed on Memorial Drive, and a street light on the corner of 8th Street and Higbee Avenue. Roll call voting Aye: Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Evans, seconded by Fanning, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff; Nay: None; Motion carried.
