Councilman Wilkie stated that the Water and Light Committee recommends that water extension be put into Lots 15, 16 and 17, Block 13, Scott's Addition. It was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Evans, that the water extension be put in. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Nay: None; Motion carried.

David Sweeney addressed the Council with reference to the equal distribution of the City's insurance business and John N. Homer addressed the Council stating that the City should make a better inspection of all buildings constructed, as to type of building, wiring and plumbing and that the City should be zoned and restricted districts be made to protect the present property owners' homes. The Mayor appointed the Building Committee to work with the real estate dealers on building restrictions and restricted zones, and the Finance Committee to work with the insurance agents on insurance policies and bonds.

The Mayor ordered the Street Commissioner to tear down the slab elk shed at Highland Park.

Lease between the City of Idaho Falls and the United States of America covering storage room in the log hangar of the Idaho Falls Municipal Airport was read. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Crabtree, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the lease. Roll call voting Aye: Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley; Nay: None; Motion carried.
