

FEBRUARY 19, 1937

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held February 19th, 1937.

There were present at said Meeting: R. B. Ewart, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Fanning; Absent: None; when the following proceedings were had to wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and approved.

The Salary Ordinance fixing the salaries for the term 1937 to 1939 was presented to the Council for consideration. It was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Wing, that the Mayor be paid the sum of \$2500.00 per annum. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Fanning, Crowley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Gourley, that each Councilman be paid the sum of \$480.00 per annum. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Wright, seconded by Wilkie, that the City Clerk be paid the sum of \$2500.00 per annum. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wilkie, that the City Treasurer be paid the sum of \$1080.00 per annum. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Fanning, that the bonds of the City Clerk and City Treasurer, shall be \$25,000.00 each. Voting Aye: Wing, Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried.

After fixing the amount of salaries and bonds to be placed in the Ordinance, the Ordinance was read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Wright, seconded by Wilkie, that the Ordinance pass on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Wright, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meeting be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second, third and final reading. Roll call voting Aye: Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Crowley, that the Ordinance pass on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Fanning; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Fanning, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gurley, Fanning, Crowley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The Ordinance was then numbered 499 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

Application for Building Permit No. 1527 by S. W. Dennis was read. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Wilkie, that the permit be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gurley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright; Voting Nay: None; Motion carried.

FEBRUARY 19, 1937

Application for Rooming House license for Ross Hotel was read. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Gourley, that the license be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The following letter was read:

Dear Sir:

At your request I am submitting the following report on street drainage for Crow's Addition which is included in Paving District #17.

Originally it was planned to follow the practice of the City in former paving districts and use the sanitary sewers to care for the surface water that will accumulate from a paving program. The experience of this practice is very unsatisfactory. Sanitary sewers were designated to care for sanitation only. In times of rapid thaws and heavy storms we have no sanitary sewers of sufficient capacity to carry the additional load.

I am attaching a blue print of the proposed system to care for flood water, which I believe is sufficient to care for the conditions.

I believe it is possible to use a portion of the projects set up for replacing water lines, and for sewer work to furnish the labor for this project.

Estimate for the completed job using relief funds for all the labor is as follows:

33 Manholes @ \$30.00 each	\$ 990.00
1570 sacks cement @ .81	1,271.70
8150 feet tile 8" to 12" @ .16	1,304.00
3080 feet tile 18# @ .18	<u>554.40</u>
	\$4,120.10
Incidental plus 10%	<u>412.00</u>
Total	\$4,532.10

It would be possible to install only the portion that comes under the paving now and complete the connections under next year's budget. The necessary cost to do this is as follows:

If the work is to be done it should be rushed as much as the weather will permit as it is probable that as soon as spring comes relief labor will be short, and a portion of those that will remain will be transferred to weed control.

It was moved by Wright, seconded by Gourley, that the City Engineer proceed with the work on the intersections and the portion that comes under the paving. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Voting Aye: None; Motion carried.

Councilman Evans stated that the City should order case lots of bolts to be used for the garbage racks that W. P. A. labor has been constructing and a revolving fund of \$50.00 could be set up to handle the cost of the bolts, as the racks would be sold for fifty cents each. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Wilkie, that the City set up a revolving fund of \$50.00 to purchase bolts for garbage racks, and this amount drawn against the contingent fund and placed with the City Clerk. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Voting Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Crabtree, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Fanning, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Passed and approved this 5th day of March, 1937.
