It was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Ewart, that the City Clerk be authorized to issue a warrant from the Clerk's Trust Fund in payment of same. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

E. S. Trask and K. D. Rose appeared before the Council as representatives of the six property owners in the warehouse district south of Short Street. Mr. Trask stated that the property owners would pay \$3151.15 to cover the cost of material for the 1450 lineal feet of 10" water extension if the City would put in the extension. He states that the present water mains were inadequate for proper fire protection, and the insurance rates will be raised soon if the condition is not corrected. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Crabtree, that the City Attorney be authorized to prepare two contracts to cover the above water main extension and fire protection agreement with these property owners. Building, in Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, Idaho, has been fixed and appointed as the time and place for hearing and considering objections to the assessment roll of Local Improvement District No. 17 of any party aggrieved by such assessments, and the further notification that such assessment roll was filed in the office of the City Clerk of said City on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1936, and that the owner or owners of any property that is assessed in such assessment roll, may file with the undersigned, objections in writing to such assessment:

NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned, Oregon Short Line Railroad Co., Union Pacific Railroad Co., Lessee, hereby protests and objects to any assessment whatsoever levied against its property in said Improvement District, on the grounds that a portion of said Improvement District, consisting of the paving of Eastern Avenue in said City of Idaho Falls, from Birch Street to Maple Street, comprising approximately six blocks, is located on and abutting property of the Railroad Company, and in accordance with provisions in contract between the Oregon Short Line Railroad Co., and the St. Anthony Railroad Co., and the City of Idaho Falls, dated August 5, 1910, identified in the files of the Railroad Company as OSL C. E. No. 1154, Audit No. 4165, whereby the Railroad Co. leased to the City of Idaho Falls a strip of right-of-way 20 feet wide parallel and adjacent to the west line of Eastern Avenue, between the north line of Thirteenth Street and the South line of "G" Street, for highway purposes, thereby making said Eastern Avenue 40 feet wide, provision is made that the parties of the first part (Railroad Companies) are not to be liable for any taxes and assessments that may be levied for the purposes of making municipal improvements along Eastern Avenue, or upon the strip herein mentioned, such as sidewalks, paving, curbing, water mains, sewers, etc.

IN VIEW WHEREOF, the undersigned Railroad Companies object and protest to the assessment of any portion of the paving expense contemplated by said Paving Improvement District No. 17 abutting its property, levied in the amount of \$1,520, or in any amount, since such assessment would contravene the existing contractual assurances given said Railroad Co. by the said City of Idaho Falls, in agreement dated August 5, 1910.
