

OCTOBER 2, 1936

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held October 2nd, 1936.

There were present at said Meeting: Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Wright; Absent: Crowley; when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Minutes of a Special Meeting held September 28th, 1936 were read and approved. The following monthly reports were read and approved: City Clerk, City Electrician, Water Works Superintendent, Sanitary Inspector, Street and Park Commissioner, Chief of Fire Department.

The following building permits were read:

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wilkie, that the permits be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Wright, Evans; Absent: Crowley; Motion carried.

Application for Bowling Alley license signed by M. A. Hamberlin was read. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Wing, that the license be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Absent: Crowley; Motion carried.

The following letter was read:

"Idaho Falls
September 26, 1936

City Council of Idaho Falls

Gentlemen:

I herewith make application to your Honorable Body for the use of ground that has been plowed, in the plat of the Capitol Hill Addition, that has been reserved for a City Park in the future. I desire to try to raise some hay that is recommended to grow without water. I would like to try some this season, and if it was a success, I would put it all in, if you do not desire to put it in shape for a park, as it would be two years before I would get anything from it.

The Acting Mayor referred the letter to the Park Committee.

Paul T. Peterson appeared before the Council as attorney for J. L. Grimmett and requested that the Council reconsider an order of the City Attorney to abate a reputed nuisance at the corner of 15th

Street and Lee Avenue where Mr. Grimmett operates a carpenter shop. The Acting Mayor referred the matter to the City Attorney for further consideration.

The Fire Chief requested that a red light be installed at the corner of D Street and Cottage Avenue by the D Street subway so that the fire truck can cross the highway in safety. The Acting Mayor referred the matter to the Building and Fire Committee.

L. W. Arave, Painting Contractor, made a complaint to the Council that it was unfair for Captain Williams of the Police Department to engage in the contracting of painting in competition with local painters while he is working for the City. Councilman Wilkie stated that it appeared to him that a police officer had an advantage in obtaining jobs as it put the matter in a compromising position. The Acting Mayor referred the matter to the Mayor and Police Committee, and Chief of Police.

Councilman Wright, Chairman of the Airport Committee, presented the bid of J. G. Andrews for drilling the well at the Airport for \$2,325.00 and stated that the Committee recommends that the bid be accepted. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Wilkie, that the bid for drilling the well at the Airport be awarded to J. G. Andrew providing that he puts up a bond to cover the bid, and a certified check for five percent of the bid. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart; Absent: Crowley; Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Evans, that the Meeting recess until next Tuesday evening, October 6th, 1936. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart; Absent: Crowley; Motion carried.
