Lease Agreement covering pump in D Street subway extending original Agreement to September 6th, 1941, between Oregon Short Line Railroad Company was read. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Gourley, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the extension rider. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Absent: Crabtree and Wilkie; Motion carried.

The following Resolution was read:

“RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, is the owner of the following described real property:

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Beginning at the Northwest corner of Lot 38 in Block 4, Capitol Hill Addition and running thence East 167.8 feet to the Westerly line of the New Yellowstone Highway; thence South 36 degrees 25' West, 154.2 feet; thence West 46.1 feet to the Southwest corner of Lot 38; thence North 124 feet to the place of beginning, being all of Lot 38 and a part of Lots 39, 40, 41, 42, and 43 in Block 4 of Capitol Hill Addition; also,

Beginning at the Northwest corner of Lot 15 in Block 5, Capitol Hill Addition and running thence East 101.7 feet to the Westerly line of the New Yellowstone Highway; thence South 36 degrees 25' West, 154.3 feet; thence West 10.1 feet to the Southwest corner of Lot 15; thence North 124 feet to the place of beginning, being a part of Lots 11, 12, 13, 14, in Block 5 of Capitol Hill Addition; also,

Beginning at the Northwest corner of Lot 30, Block 5, Capitol Hill Addition, and running thence East 98.3 feet to the Westerly line of the new Yellowstone Highway; thence South 36 degrees, 25' West, 154.2 feet to the South line of said Block 5; thence West 6.6 feet to the Southwest corner of Lot 30; thence North 124 feet to the place of beginning, being a part of Lots 30, 31, 32, and 33 in Block 5 of Capitol Hill Addition; also,

Beginning at the Northwest corner of Lot 18, Block 15, Dwight's Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and running thence East along the North line of the said Block 15, 59.4 feet to the Westerly line of the Yellowstone Highway; thence South 36 degrees 25' West along the Westerly line of the said Yellowstone Highway, 100.00 feet to the West line of said Lot 18; thence North along the West line of said Lot 18, 80.5 feet to the point of beginning.

WHEREAS, said property was not acquired or used as a public park, playground or public building site and is not needed for municipal purposes,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that said property be offered for sale at private sale and that the Clerk publish notice of intention to sell said property as provided by law."

It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Ewart, that the Resolution be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Absent: Wilkie and Crabtree; Motion carried.

The following Petition was read:

"To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of Idaho Falls, Idaho:

We, the undersigned property owners and tenants situated on Park Avenue, respectfully petition you as follows:

That, whereas, we are located on Park Avenue, between Broadway and "C" Streets, and are continually having trouble with the present sewer system, and more particularly on occasions of heavy rains or any heavy run off of moisture, due to the fact that the present

sewer system is inadequate to carry the necessary run-off. That the present sewer travels down Park Avenue, in what we are informed and believe to be a ten inch pipe.

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That the present system results in trouble and expense to us by reason of the same backing up on occasions, flooding our basements and causing loss and damage to the stock of tenants and occupants of the various buildings located within the above named areas.

That the area above mentioned is entirely built up with valuable properties, and the property owners and tenants therein located pay a heavy portion of the public tax of Idaho Falls, and as such are entitled to every consideration at your hands.

Therefore, we respectfully petition you to immediately cause the said condition to be remedied, and that the City Engineer consult with the property owners as to the best and most feasible manner in which to either enlarge the present system, or erect a lateral to the present storm sewer, resulting in the relief which we seek.

We trust you will fully appreciate the importance of this matter and lose no unnecessary time in remedying this long delayed necessity, which exists in the very heart of the business district.

The Mayor referred the Petition to the Water and Light Committee. D. H. Taylor appeared before the Council and requested that the bill for \$67.00 which he received for cleaning the sewer west of his service station be cancelled. It was moved by Wing, seconded by Crowley, that the bill for cleaning the sewer charged to Gem State Oil Company be cancelled. Roll call voting Aye: Crowley, Wright, Wing, Gourley; Nay: Ewart and Evans; Absent: Wilkie and Crabtree; Motion lost.

Dear Sir:

In connection with the proposed paving project for which \$34,118.00 grant has been approved, I wish to make the following recommendation.

I recommend that the M. J. pipe in the streets to be paved be replaced with C. I. pipe and that service connections be installed for each fifty feet of frontage of copper pipe.

For Crow's Addition I recommend that the pipe be replaced in the east and west streets with 4" pipe and that an extension of 8" C. I. pipe be installed in the alley between 10th and 11th Streets to Holmes Avenue, thence north along Holmes to 1st Street and connected to the 6" main there.

An application has been submitted to the Boise WPA Department for labor and a portion of the material for the replacement.

I believe it advisable to order the following material immediately:

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Gentlemen:

Telegraphic information was received July 28th, 1936, that the PWA had approved a grant of \$34,118.00 for the proposed paving project in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

The original estimate for the project was for \$73,373.10, divided as follows:

District Bonds	\$31,594.50
City Funds	6,433.00
Government Grant	<u>35,356.60</u>
Total	\$73,373.10

The grant is \$1,238.60 less than the amount asked for which will have to be made up in some manner as I believe the original estimate was as low as we will be able to complete the job.

The proposal did not include curb or the paving of north and south streets. I believe it is possible to have a WPA project approved for curb and paving the north and south streets if it is possible to finance a portion of the material. I have made an estimate of the project which amounts to \$76,689.71 of which \$42,224.84 is labor. All of the property affected in this property either overlaps or is adjacent to the proposed PWA project. If the district is enlarged and a bond issue of \$60,000 can be sold, it will provide the necessary amount to do the additional work.

It was moved by Evans, seconded by Crowley, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Absent: Wilkie and Crabtree; Motion carried.
