

FEBRUARY 21, 1936

Minutes of a regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held February 21st, 1936.

There were present at said Meeting: Barzilla W. Clark; Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart; Absent: None; when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and approved.

Ed Carney and A. E. Stanger requested that the City sponsor a W. P. A. noxious weed eradication project in Bonneville County as the County Commissioners would not put up any money for any W. P. A. project, and their only hope was help from the City. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Crowley, that the matter be referred to the Finance Committee with power to act. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The following applications for licenses were read:

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Ewart, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Application for building permit No. 1264 signed by Chas. A. Huss was read. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Wing, that the permit be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The following Resolution was presented to the Council by Mrs. Otto E. McCutcheon and Mrs. E. L. Shattuck:

"Resolved, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls be urged to buy a lanace (?) of privately owned property in the Memorial Part site and obtain title to all of said property so that they can begin actual development of the Park this year." The Mayor referred the Resolution to the Park Committee.

Notice of annual meeting of the Water Users Protective Union to be held in the Courthouse on February 24th, 1936 was read. The Mayor appointed Councilmen Ewart to represent the City at said Meeting.

The following letter was read:

The following letter from the Mayor was read:

"I am placing a veto on the recent action of the Council in revoking 18 Beer Licenses. No evidence has been presented to the Council which warrants such action, though there are rumors that a member of the Council hired someone whose responsibility is not vouched for, to obtain evidence against these business houses. Such a spy system on a larger scale is at the bottom of the trouble in many European nations just now, causing riots and other violence. Arrests seem to be an evidence of activity and interest, and have some news value. But unless convicting evidence can be presented, such action merely amounts to one community group harassing another.

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It was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Wright, that the Resolution be passed over the Mayor's veto. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Ewart, Crowley; Nay: Wing and Gourley; Motion carried.

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2 OF ORDINANCE NO. 468 OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, PROVIDING THAT IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY RETAILER TO SELL BEER IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, UNTIL HE HAS OBTAINED A LICENSE THEREFORE; PROVIDING THAT THE APPLICATION FOR THE LICENSEE SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND THE POLICE COMMITTEE OF THE CITY COUNCIL AND PROVIDING THAT IF THE CHIEF OF POLICE COMMITTEE FAIL OR REFUSE TO APPROVE THE APPLICATION, THE APPLICATION SHALL BE REFERRED TO THE CITY COUNCIL" was read by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wright, that the Ordinance pass on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Crabtree, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Crowley, seconded by Ewart, that the Ordinance pass on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Wright, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then numbered 488 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls

Chief Marker requested that the Purchasing Agent be authorized to purchase 500 feet of new fire hose that was provided for in this year's budget, and also an inhalator. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Evans, that the Purchasing Agent be authorized to purchase 500 feet of fire hose, and the inhalator. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing; Nay: None; motion carried.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Evans, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley; Nay: None; Motion carried.
