

JANUARY 17, 1936

Minutes of a regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held January 17th, 1936.

There were present at said Meeting: Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Ewart, Crowley; Absent: Gourley; when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

Minutes of the last regular Meeting were read and approved.

The following applications for Beer Licenses were read:

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Ewart, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Ewart, Crowley, Wright; Absent: Gourley; Motion carried.

Applications for licenses to Retail Beer signed by Elm Street Grocery and Central Fruit Store were read. Councilman Ewart stated that these stores should not be allowed to sell beer as they are too close to the schools and beer should not be sold around school children. It was moved by Ewart that the licenses not be granted. Motion lost for want of a second.

Applications for Beer Licenses signed by Elm Street Grocery and Central Fruit Store were again read. It was moved by Wing, seconded by Crowley, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Nay: Ewart; Absent: Gourley; Motion carried.

The following applications for Beer Licenses were read: John Ford, F. J. Johnson & Co., Bonneville Club, Broadway Club. Councilman Wilkie, Chairman of the Police Committee, stated that the Police Committee would not okay these applications as they have proof and evidence that liquor is being sold over the bar at these applicant's places of business. It was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Crowley, that the applications be rejected. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Absent: Gourley; Motion carried.

Application for an Electrician's license for Hisgen Electric was read. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Wright, that the license be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing; Absent: Gourley; Motion carried.

The following applications for building permits were read:

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Ewart, that the permits be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing; Absent: Gourley; Motion carried.

The following letter was read:

“Idaho Falls, Idaho
January 17, 1936

Honorable Mayor and City Council:

Gentlemen:

Referring to the petition by residents of Holmes Avenue wherein they ask for the erection of signs on that Avenue because of damage caused by loose stock, we recommend that a sign be placed at each end of the street in question, and two signs at intermediate points, with substantially the following working:

“Drivers of loose stock on this street will
be held personally liable for any
damage to private property.”

It was moved by Wright, seconded by Crowley, that the recommendation of the Street and Alley Committee be adopted. Roll call voting Aye: Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Ewart; Absent: Gourley; Motion carried.

Councilman Gourley entered the Meeting at this time.

The Chief of Fire Departments annual report for the year 1935 was read.

Councilman Wright stated that the City could buy the Allis-Chalmers Street Grader and he would recommend that the City purchase same at this price. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Crowley, that the City purchase the grader from the East Side Lumber Co. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Councilman Crowley requested the City Attorney, Albaugh, to advise the Council just what action the City should take in regards to the taxicab operators not being able to furnish a \$1,000.00 bond for each taxicab. City Attorney Albaugh stated that he had made an investigation of the cause of the taxicab operators not being able to furnish bonds and the insurance agents advised him that they would write indemnity bonds for all the taxicab operators if the operators could get some responsible property owner to sign the bond surety.

It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Wright, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Absent: None; Motion carried. Passed and approved this 7th day of February, 1936.
