It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wilkie, that the permits be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Contract between the Western Union Telegraph Company and the City of Idaho Falls, covering bracket attachment on sixteen poles for messenger service line owned by the Western Union and attached to City light poles was read. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Wing, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the Agreement. Roll call voting Aye: Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

A letter from Attorney William S. Holden, asking the City to pay Mrs. Flora M. Clark \$150.00 for a strip of her land fronting on 9th Street, or move her old ditch and open it up so that it can be used again was read. The Mayor referred same to the Street and Alley Committee.

P E T I T I O N

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council
Of Idaho Falls, Idaho

Whereas, we, the undersigned property owners and residents of or near Holmes Avenue, have suffered considerable damage and annoyance on account of loose livestock running over our property; and

Whereas, we believe it very desirable and profitable to keep our yards, flower gardens, shrubs, etc. in neat and orderly manner, which is impossible to do with loose sheep, cattle, horses, etc. being driven through this vicinity.

We, therefore, pray your honorable body to erect signs reading, "No Loose Livestock Permitted on this Street", and have one placed at each end of said Avenue, and instruct our police to enforce said order.

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT LICENSES SHALL BE REVOKED FOR THE SALE OF BEVERAGES CONTAINING MORE THAN 4% OF ALCOHOL BY WEIGHT; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF THE REVOCATION OF A LICENSE AND FOR THE REFUND OF ANY UNEARNED PART OF THE LICENSE PAID: AND FOR THE REVIEW OF THE REVOCATION OF A LICENSE BY ANY COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION", was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance pass on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Wilkie, seconded Evans, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Crowley, seconded by Gourley, that the Ordinance pass on its second reading.

Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Evans, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance pass on its third and final reading. Roll call

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voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then passed to the Mayor for his approval.

Councilman Ewart presented the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF SALOONS AND OTHER SIMILAR RESORTS, AND MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE ANY SUCH SALOONS OR SIMILAR RESORTS WITH OUT FIRST PAYING A FEE THEREFORE, AND FIXING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE, (CAN'T READ FROM BOOK, SOMETHING MISSING)

which was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Ewart that the Ordinance pass on its first reading. Motion lost for want of a second.

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO PARK A MOTOR VEHICLE ON CERTAIN STREETS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS FOR A LONGER PERIOD THAN ONE HOUR IN THE SAME BLOCK ON ANY ONE DAY, AND PROVIDING FOR VIOLATION THEREOF" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Wright, that the Ordinance pass on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Wilkie, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call voting Aye: Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Gourley, seconded by Crowley, that the Ordinance pass on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Wing, that the Ordinance pass on its third and final reading. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then passed to the Mayor for his approval.

Owen King addressed the Council in regard to men who went off the relief rolls on May 1st, 1935, and could not be placed back on the relief rolls after November 1st, 1935, under the W. P. A. He requested that the Mayor and City Council take the matter up with the State Director of the W. P. A. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Ewart, that the Mayor and City Council go on record and **DECEMBER 6, 1935**

recommend a change in this ruling so that all of the men affected by this Federal Regulation can be placed back on the relief rolls under the W. P. A. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Wilkie, that Lawrence Boyle be recommended for the head or administrator of the New State set-up in Bonneville County for direct relief. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The following letter covering widows' water and light accounts was presented by the Electric Light & Water Committee.
