Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held October 4<sup>th</sup>, 1935.

There were present at said Meeting: Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Crabtree, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Absent: Wing and Gourley; when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting and of a Special Meeting held September 28<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, 1935, were read and approved.

The following monthly reports were read and approved: City Clerk, City Electrician, Water Works Superintendent, Sanitary Inspector, City Physician, Chief of Fire Department, Street and Park Commissioner.

The following letter was read:

October 4<sup>th</sup>, 1935

"Honorable Mayor and City Council  
Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

I am calling to your attention the fact that Fruit and Grocery Stores are placing on the sidewalks of our City, baskets of peaches, pears, tomatoes, apples, prunes, etc., and making a regular huckster's stand. I recommend, from a sanitary and health measure, that you pass regulations preventing this condition in the future.

I have visited the offenders on numerous occasions and they promised not to throw decomposed fruit on the sidewalks and streets, but I find it has been done on several occasions.

Thanking you for consideration in this matter and assuring you I will continue to try and control the spillage on the streets and sidewalks, but believe an ordinance prohibiting same would remedy this condition, I remain

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE ISSUANCE OF A TAXICAB UNLESS THE OWNER SHALL HAVE FIRST FILED WITH THE CITY CLERK AN INSURANCE POLICY OR SURETY BOND PROTECTING THE PUBLIC AGAINST LOSS OR DAMAGE FROM THE OPERATION OF TAXICABS AND MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE A TAXICAB WITHOUT HAVING ON FILE SUCH POLICY OF INSURANCE OR BOND AND PROVIDING THE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Ewart, that the Ordinance pass on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Absent: Wing and Gourley; Motion carried. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Crabtree, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second, third and final readings. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wilkie, that the Ordinance pass on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Absent: Wing and Gourley; Motion carried. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Ewart, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance pass on its first reading. An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT PLACES OF BUSINESS SELLING AT RETAIL BEVERAGES CONTAINING ONE-HALF OF ONE PER CENT OF ALCOHOL, OR MORE, SHALL BE CLOSED FROM TWELVE O'CLOCK MIDNIGHT TO 6:00 A.M., PROVIDING THAT IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL TO HAVE MUSIC OR PERMIT DANCING IN SUCH PLACES OF BUSINESS, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Crowley, that the Ordinance pass its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Absent: Wing and Gourley; Nay: Wilkie; Motion carried. It was

moved by Ewart, seconded by Evans, that the Meeting recess until Tuesday evening, October 8<sup>th</sup>, 1935.
