Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Wright; Absent: Evans, and Crowley; Motion carried.

A claim for \$3000.00 signed by M. L. Weaver for damages for the injury and the killing of foxes caused by blasting at the City Park formerly known as Reno Park on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of April, 1934, was read. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Wilkie, that the claim be rejected. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Wright, Wilkie; Absent: Crowley and Evans; Motion carried.

Building Permit No. 1123 signed by L. M. Earl was read. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the permit be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Wright, Wilkie, Crabtree; Absent: Crowley and Evans; Motion carried.

A letter signed by Oden & Felt and Idaho Japanese Association requesting the City to close the alley between the new highway and Lee Avenue running East and West between First Street and Lomax Street was read. No action was taken by the Council.

Chief of the Fire Department, Julius Marker, requested the City Council to go on record as favoring the passage of the Civil Service Bill placing all Firemen and Policemen in cities of the second

class under a City Civil Service Commission. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Gourley, that a letter or a Resolution be mailed to our representatives at Boise favoring the adoption of the Civil Service Bill for cities of the second class for Firemen and Policemen. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Wright, Wilkie, Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart; Absent: Crowley, and Evans; Motion carried.

It was moved by Wright, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Wilkie, Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Absent: Crowley and Evans; Motion carried.

Passed and approved this 15<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1935.
