The following Audit Proposal Contract was read:

Gentlemen:

I desire to submit the following proposal covering the regular quarterly audit examination of the affairs of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, for the two Fiscal Year periods, ending April 30, 1937.

PROPOSAL: I propose to audit the books of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, for the period from May 1, 1935, to April 30, 1937, on the following terms:

\$750.00 for each Fiscal Year period or a total of \$1,500.00
for the two year period.

The audit of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, shall be performed in accordance with the Uniform Specifications for Audit of all incorporated cities, as adopted by the Bureau of Public Accounts in compliance with H. B. #123, 1935 Session Laws and subsequent amendments, and audit shall be completed within ninety days after close of the Fiscal Year period.

My fees, subject to the existing statutes of Idaho pertaining to incorporated city audits, will be payable upon approval by the Mayor and Council of the reports, at the rate of \$162.50 for the first three quarters of each Fiscal Year and \$262.50 for the fourth quarter of each Fiscal Year.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Gourley, that the Garbage Contract with Roe E. Gillespie be renewed and extended for two years, on the same terms as the present contract, and that the Mayor be authorized to sign the renewal contract. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley; Nay: Wilkie; Absent: Wright; Motion carried.

The following Ordinance was read in full by the Clerk:

ORDINANCE NO. 480

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, REFUNDING BONDS IN THE PRINCIPAL SUM OF \$20,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING A LIKE AMOUNT OF OUTSTANDING MUNICIPAL COUPON BONDS OF SAID CITY, PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID REFUNDING BONDS AND PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES TO PAY SAID BONDS AND THE INTEREST THEREON.

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, has issued, and has outstanding, its valid negotiable coupon bonds in the principal sum of \$20,000.00 consisting of the following bonds:

General Obligation

\$20,000.00. 5½% Municipal Coupon Bonds, dated July 1, 1919, optional July 1, 1929, due July 1, 1939, consisting of twenty bonds in the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, numbered 16 to 35, inclusive, payable out of the sinking fund.

WHEREAS, said City does not have sufficient funds in its treasury for the payment of said outstanding municipal bonds or any of them; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of said City has determined and hereby determines that said outstanding indebtedness may be refunded, to the profit and benefit of said City and without incurring any additional liability by the issuance of refunding bonds in the same principal amount as the unpaid principal of such outstanding bonds and at a lower rate of interest; and,

WHEREAS, this City Council deems it advisable and necessary to issue refunding bonds of the City in order to reduce the rate of interest and to postpone the time of payment of its outstanding bonded indebtedness and thereby lighten the tax burden upon the owners of property in said City.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO:

Section 1. For the purpose of paying, redeeming and refunding the outstanding bonded indebtedness of said City hereinbefore described, and said City shall issue its Refunding Bonds, Series 1935, in the principal sum of \$20,000.00, consisting of 20 bonds in the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 20, inclusive, dated July 1, A.D. 1935, bearing interest from their date until paid, at the rate of 2¾% per annum, payable semiannually on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, both principal and interest being payable in lawful money of the United States of America, at the office of the City Treasurer in Idaho Falls, Idaho, said bonds maturing \$5,000.00 on July 1st in each of the years 1937 to 1940, inclusive. The bonds maturing in the year 1940 shall be redeemable at the option of the City on and after the 1st day of July, 1936.

Section 2. Said bonds, the interest coupons to be attached thereto, and the certificate of registration to be endorsed thereon, shall be in substantially the following forms:

The City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, in the State of Idaho, acknowledges itself indebted and for value received hereby provides to pay to the bearer hereof the principal sum of

ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS

on the first day of July, A. D. 19__ , together with interest thereon from the date hereof until paid at the rate of two and three-fourths per centum (2¾%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of January and July in each year, as evidenced by interest coupons hereto attached, both principal and interest being payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the City Treasurer in Idaho Falls, Idaho, upon presentation and surrender of the annexed coupons and this bond as they severally become due.

(In bonds maturing July 1, 1940, shall be inserted the following: "The City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, reserves the right to redeem this bond on and any time after the first day of July, A. D., 1936.)"

This bond is issued by said City of Idaho Falls for the purpose of paying, redeeming and refunding valid outstanding bonded indebtedness of said City in conformity and after full compliance with the Constitution and Laws of the State of Idaho, including the "Municipal Bond Law", (Chapter 2 Title 55 and Chapter 24 Title 49 Idaho Code Annotated), and all other laws thereunto meeting thereof held prior to the issuance of this bond.

It is hereby certified, recited and warranted that said City is now and for many years has been a body politic and corporate, duly organized, existing and operating under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Idaho, and under the control of a duly organized City Council as the duly constituted corporate authority thereof; that all acts and things requisite to the issuance hereof have been duly and regularly done and performed, and that this bond is duly and regularly issued; that the total indebtedness of said City, including that of this bond, and the bonded indebtedness for which it was issued, does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation; and that due provision has been made for the levy and collection of a direct annual ad valorem tax upon all the taxable property in said City, in addition to all other taxes, sufficient to pay the interest accruing hereon promptly when and as the same falls due and also to discharge the principal hereof at maturity.

The full faith and credit of such city and all taxable property in said city, in addition to all other taxes, sufficient to pay the interest accruing promptly when and as the same falls due and also to discharge the principal hereof at maturity.

The full faith and credit of such city and all taxable property therein are and shall continue to be pledged for and until the full payment of the principal of and the interest on this bond.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, Idaho, by its City Council, has caused this bond to be signed by the Mayor of said City, countersigned by its Treasurer, sealed with the seal of said City, attested by its Clerk, and attached interest coupons to be signed with the engraved facsimile signature of said Treasurer, as of the First day of July, A. Section 3. Each of said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk, countersigned by the City Treasurer, respectively, and sealed with the seal of said City; and each of the interest coupons to be attached to each of said bonds shall be executed by the engraved facsimile signature of said City Treasurer; and the officers in this paragraph mentioned are hereby authorized, ordered, and directed to cause said bonds and coupons to be prepared substantially in the forms respectively hereinbefore set forth, and to execute the same for and on behalf of said City as and in the manner aforesaid. After their execution and before said bonds are issued they shall be registered by the Clerk and Treasurer of said City, respectively, in public record books kept in their offices for that purpose, which shall show each bond, its number, amount, date of maturity, rate of interest, place of payment, number and denomination of coupons attached, a proper description thereof for future identification, the name and post office address of the person or persons to whom said bonds are delivered, and the date of delivery.

Section 4. Notice of the intention to sell said bonds and requesting bids therefore shall be mailed to the State Auditory at Boise, Idaho, at least fifteen days prior to the time fixed for said sale, and shall be published in Post Register, the official newspaper of said City, in three consecutive weekly publications. The date of sale shall be not less than twenty-one full days from and after the date of the first publication of such notice. Said notice shall be in substantially the following form:

First in each of the years 1937 to 1940, inclusive, (Bonds due in 1940 to be redeemable on and after July 1, 1936). Consisting of twenty bonds in the denomination of \$1,000.00 each.

Sealed bids for said bonds will be received by the City Council of said City at the City Hall on or before the 5th day of July, A. D. 1935, at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M.

Bidders are requested and required to submit bids for said bonds specifying (a) the lowest rate of interest and premium, if any, above par, at which the bidder will purchase such bonds, or (b) the lowest rate of interest at which the bidder will purchase such bonds at par.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a certified check made payable to said City in the sum of \$1,000.00 or by a cash deposit in a like amount, which certified check or cash deposit shall be returned if the bid submitted is not accepted. The certified check or cash deposit of any successful bidder who shall fail, neglect, or refuse to accept the bonds so sold, and to complete and pay therefore in accordance with the terms of his bid within thirty days following the acceptance thereof, shall be forfeited to said City. Said bonds shall be sold at not less than par and accrued interest to date of delivery. Said City reserves the right of rejection of any and all bids.

Section 5. In order to provide the necessary funds to pay the interest accruing on said refunding bonds promptly when and as the same falls due and for the purpose of paying said refunding bonds at maturity, there shall be and there is hereby levied on all the taxable property in said City in addition to all other taxes the following direct annual ad valorem taxes in each of the years, A. D. 1935, A. D. 1938, inclusive, sums sufficient to produce for principal and interest the following net amounts:

and said taxes when collected shall by the City Treasurer be kept in a separate fund to be known as and designated "Refunding Bond Fund" which shall be irrevocably pledged to and used solely for the payment of the interest on the principal of the said bonds when due, so long as any of said bonds or the interest coupons thereto appertaining remain outstanding and unpaid; and for greater certainty the City Council of said City shall in each of said years 1935

to 1938, both inclusive, include the bond tax hereinabove levied for such year in the annual estimate and budget for said city for such year, and said bond tax shall in each of said years be certified, extended upon the tax rolls and collected by the same officers in the same manner and at the same time as the taxes for general purposes for said City are certified, extended and collected.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the City Council and it is hereby required annually at the time and in the manner provided by law for the levying of other taxes, to ratify and carry out the provisions hereof with reference to the levying of taxes and to require the officers

of and for said County to extend and collect such taxes in the manner provided by law, for the purpose of creating a fund for the payment of the interest on and the principal of said bonds, and the said taxes, when so collected, shall be kept for and applied only to the payment of said interest and principal of said bonds as hereinbefore specified; but nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to prevent said city from applying any funds that may be in the treasury and available for that purpose to the payment of said principal and interest as the same, respectfully, mature, and upon any such payment the levy or levies herein provided may be to that extend diminished.

Section 7. The Mayor, Clerk and Treasurer of said City, the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners, and the Clerk, Auditor and Treasurer of said County are hereby authorized, ordered and directed to furnish such certificates or other documents as will fully evidence the proceedings had preliminary to the issuance of said bonds, the regularity and sufficiency thereof, and the acts of said officers in the premises are hereby declared authorized, ratified, approved and confirmed.

Section 8. It is hereby certified, recited and warranted that all conditions, acts, and things necessary or essential to the validity of the said refunding bonds and required by law to be done, have been fully done and performed, and when said refunding bonds are exchanged for outstanding bonds, as provided herein, they shall be incontestable by the City or any one on its behalf.

Section 9. The provisions of this Ordinance and each of the said refunding bonds and each of the interest coupons thereto attached, shall constitute and the same are hereby declared to be binding and irrevocable contract between said City and the holders of said refunding bonds and the holder from time to time of each of said bonds and the interest coupons thereto appertaining.

Section 10. All Ordinances or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions hereof be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 11. After adoption of this Ordinance shall be recorded in the Book of Ordinances of said city, shall be published in the Post Register, a newspaper published in said City, and shall become effective immediately upon such publication.

It was moved by Wing, seconded by Ewart, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Evans; Absent: Wright; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Crowley, seconded by Ewart, that the Ordinance pass on its second

reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Evans, Wilkie; Absent: Wright; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Evans, that the Ordinance be placed on its third and final reading and be adopted, passed and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Absent: Wright; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then numbered 480 and passed to the Mayor for his approval and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.
