

MAY 17, 1935

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held May 17th, 1935.

There were present at said Meeting: Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; when the following proceedings were had to wit:

Minutes of a Regular Meeting held May 3rd, 1935, and recessed Meeting of said Meeting held May 10th, 1935, were read and approved.

Application of Buffet Taxi for renewal of taxicab license was read. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Ewart, that the license be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Motion carried.

The following applications for building permits were read:

No. 1152 signed by P. F. Hollibaugh
No. 1153 signed by J. R. Ashliman

It was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Wing, that the permits be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing; Motion carried.

The following petition was read:

The Mayor referred same to the Street & Alley Committee.
The following Agreement was read:

“AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Chamber of Commerce of Idaho Falls, Idaho, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and the American Legion, Bonneville Post #56, of Idaho Falls, Idaho, are desirous of

joining together for the purpose of staging a community celebration on or about 4th day of July, 1935, and to participate severally in the execution thereof; now therefore,

MAY 17, 1935

It is hereby expressly understood and agreed that the Chamber of Commerce of the City of Idaho Falls shall put on the parade and shall furnish the sum of \$333.00 in cash; that the City of Idaho Falls shall furnish the City Park and the sum of \$333.00 in cash; and that the American Legion, Bonneville Post #56 of Idaho Falls shall furnish all manpower and the sum of \$333.00 in cash, all of said sums to be available on demand after the signing of this contract.

The management of said joint celebration shall be vested in a committee of six, composed of two members from each of the foregoing organizations, and officers of the committee shall be chosen by the members thereof.

It is hereby expressly understood and agreed that no concessions, tickets, amusements sold, bills contracted or any agreement of any nature whatever shall be made except with the approval of the general committee.

It is hereby further agreed that the participation in the net results and profits, if any, in this enterprises, shall be divided in the following manner, to-wit:

\$333.00 shall be paid to the American Legion out of the moneys received for concessions sold by the general committee for the celebration; the balance of moneys from concessions, gate receipts, or any other moneys coming into the general committee shall be placed in one fund which, after deducting all of the expenses of the celebration, shall be divided as follows: one-third to the Chamber of Commerce of Idaho Falls; one-third to the City of Idaho Falls and one-third to the American Legion, Bonneville Post #56 of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Dated this 17th day of May, 1935."

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Crabtree, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the above agreement. Roll call voting Aye: Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart; Motion carried.

The Mayor appointed the following Councilmen to act on the above committee mentioned in said agreement: Worth D. Wright and Gradie S. Evans.

Maintenance Agreement between Electrical Products Consolidated and the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, covering service for 24 months on neon sign display on City Building at \$50.00 per month from May 1st, 1935 to May 1st, 1937 was read. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Gourley, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the Maintenance Agreement. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley; Motion carried.

Chairman Crowley of the Finance Committee stated that we are now paying 5 ½ % interest on optional bonds which mature in 1939, and these bonds should be refunded on a cheaper rate of interest which can be secured for 3 ½ %. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Wright, that the Ordinance Committee prepare notice of Bond Redemption and an Ordinance providing for the issuance of municipal coupon refunding bonds in the amount of \$24,000.00 for the purpose of refunding and redeeming a like amount of outstanding bonds. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright; Motion carried.

Chairman Wright of the Street & Alley Committee stated that some satisfactory adjustment or settlement should be made with B. M. Rogers for his claim of \$309.40 for dirt which was not allowed on May 10th, 1935. He also stated that the City had bills against B. M. Rogers in the amount of \$186.60. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Gourley, that the City cancel all bills against B. M.

Rogers as payment for his claim against the City for 2210 cubic yards of dirt which he delivered to the City: claims against B. M. Rogers - \$186.60 and claim against City for Dirt - \$309.40. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Nay: Wilkie and Ewart; Motion carried.

The following notice of sale was presented and read:

“NOTICE OF SALE

At a Regular Meeting of the City Council held May 3rd, 1935, the following portions of lots were authorized to be sold: Lots 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, in Block 8 of Dwight’s Addition to the City of Idaho Falls.

It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Ewart, that the matter of sale of these portions of lots be referred to the Finance Committee with power to act. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Motion carried.

The Mayor appointed Lloyd Stalker as Building, Plumbing and Wiring Inspector. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Wright, that the appointment be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Motion carried.

The Mayor appointed Herman Drewes as Superintendent of Water Department. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Wright, that the appointment be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing; Motion carried.

Councilman Wright stated that the four Wards of the City should be re-divided placing the population more on an equal percentage according to Wards. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Evans, that Ordinance Committee be instructed to prepare an Ordinance for a re-division of the four Wards of the City of Idaho Falls, so that an equal number of electors as nearly as possible be placed in each Ward as provided by law. Roll call voting Aye: Ewart, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley; Motion carried.

The Budget Estimate for the Fiscal Year 1935-1936 was presented and read to the Council. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Wright, that the Budget Estimate for the Fiscal Year 1935-1936 in the total sum of \$374,618.46 be approved and published in the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls according to the law applying to budgets. Roll call voting Aye: Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart; Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Evans, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Wing, Gourley, Ewart, Crowley; Motion carried.

Passed and approved this 7th day of June, 1935.
