“To his Honor, the Mayor and members of the Council of the City of Idaho Falls.

Resolutions passed by the Beautification Committee of the Idaho Falls Chamber of Commerce, May 9, 1935. that this Meeting go on record as opposing the erection of any gasoline tanks within the City limits of a capacity exceeding 550 gallons and further that if any tanks are erected that they be placed in the same districts as is now occupied by other tanks outside of the City limits. That the members of the Council of Idaho Falls be asked for the sum

of \$150.00 to help defray the expenses of a Home and Garden contest and a Flower Show this summer."

Gentlemen:

As requested by the Council at the Meeting of May 3, 1935, I wish to submit the following report on the cost of drilling the bottom of Well #3.

The total hole drilled to date amounts to 368 lineal feet. Taking into account wages for drilling, rig rental, repairs, and necessary materials for the work, this has cost the City \$5.72 per lineal foot.

The pump has been installed and was tried out yesterday and today, the water being pumped into the river. The flow has not been measured but checked against the amount put out by the "I" Street Well. Pressure tests would indicate that the one pump installed will discharge more water than the "I" Street well. The draw down in the shaft with discharge only amount to 3 1/2 feet, indicating that we have sufficient water for the present setting.
