

MARCH 15, 1935

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Minutes of a regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held March 15<sup>th</sup>, 1935.

There were present at said Meeting: Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Gourley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart; Absent: Crowley; when the following proceedings were had to wit:

Minutes of two previous Meetings were read and approved.

The following applications for licenses were read:

Ross Hotel	Rooming House

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Ewart, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley; Absent: Crowley; Motion carried.

Building permit No. 1128 signed by D. E. Ireland was read. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Gourley, that the permit be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Ewart, Gourley; Absent: Mehlhoff and Crowley; Motion carried.

The following letter was read:

Idaho Falls, Idaho  
March 14, 1935

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council  
Of Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

We have purchased Lots 8 to 15, inclusive, in Block 8 of Dwight's Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and would like also to purchase the fractional Lots which the City owns adjacent to this property. Will appreciate if you will give this matter consideration at your earliest convenience as we would like to get a building started as soon as possible.

The Mayor referred same to the Finance Committee.

An Agreement dated March 1<sup>st</sup>, 1935, between the City of Idaho Falls and Merland Clark and LeRoy Clark covering the manufacturing of about 3000 feet of concrete sewer pipe was read. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Ewart, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the Agreement. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Ewart, Gourley, Wright, Evans; Absent: Mehlhoff and Crowley; Motion carried.

Monthly report of the Chief of Fire Department was read.

The following Resolution was read:

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"RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, there is now pending before the Congress of the United States an Act generally known and referred to as the "Townsend Old Age Revolving Pension Bill", and also known of as the "McGroarty Bill",

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, that we most respectfully urge the passage of said bill by the House of Representatives and the United States Senate, in its present form,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Clerk of said City is hereby directed to forward forthwith certified copies of this Resolution to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and to the Senators and Representatives in Congress from the State of Idaho."

It was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Ewart, that the Resolution be adopted. Roll call voting Aye: Ewart, Gourley, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Nay: None; Absent: Mehlhoff and Crowley; Pass: Wright; Motion carried.

The following letter was read:

"Idaho Falls, Idaho  
March 15, 1935

Mayor & City Council  
Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

We herewith submit a proposal to you to build a road starting at the Southeast corner of Section 14, to the Northeast corner of Section 14; this road to be a 60 foot right of way, standard grade road according to state specifications, and graveled, according to state specifications, with crushed rock.

If the City of Idaho Falls will pay \$1500.00 for this work, furnish the crushed gravel and the fencing material which will be needed, we will secure the right of way, place the fencing in proper order after the work is done, and take care of all culverts. This would make a complete high-grade road to the Southwest corner of the Idaho Falls Airport.

This \$1500.00 is figured at actual cost of doing this work with no contractor's profit and no cost for obtaining the right of way. This right of way alone would cost the City of Idaho Falls more than the proposed sum which we are asking to do this work, if they had to obtain it.

The Mayor referred same to the Street and Ditch Committee.

Probate Judge Huffaker addressed the Council requesting the enforcement of the present Curfew Ordinance and report at the next regular Meeting with their recommendations as to any

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necessary amendments to the present Ordinance. Roll call voting Aye: Gourley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Ewart; Absent: Crowley, and Mehlhoff; Motion carried.

Councilman Gourley stated that some action must be taken by the Council in regard to future celebrations to be held at the City Park as to the amount of rent per day the City would charge for the use of the Park and to what extent the City would sponsor any celebrations or cooperate with the American Legion and Chamber of Commerce. The Mayor appointed the Chairman of the Park and Finance Committees to meet with the American Legion and the Merchants Division of the Chamber of Commerce and, work out some rental agreement with these organizations.

It was moved by Evans, seconded by Gourley, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Ewart, Gourley; Absent: Mehlhoff, Crowley; Motion carried.
