It was moved by Wright, seconded by Ewart, that the bills for the month of August, 1933, in the amount of \$24,444.16 be paid and warrants be issued for same. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie. Note: Councilman Wilkie voted to approve all claims except the claim of R. E. Gillespie for payment on garbage contract.

The following monthly reports were read: City Clerk, Police Judge, Chief Fire Department, City Electrician, Chief of Police, Street & Park Commissioner, Sanitary Inspector, Water Master. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Crabtree, that the reports be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Motion carried.

Two applications for water extensions were read from F. L. King and Orville Buck, and M. Maldo. The Mayor referred same to the Electric Light and Water Committee.

The Finance Committee presented bond of Roe E. Gillespie for \$1000.00 and schedule bond written by Standard Accident Insurance Co. for \$8,000.00 covering eight members of the Police Department. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Gourley, that the bonds be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley. Motion carried. Note: Councilman Wilkie voted Nay on the R. E. Gillespie bond.

Police Committee's report was read relative to institutions on Eagle Rock Street. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Evans, that the report of the Police Committee and recommendation of the Chief of Police relative to the revoking of the following licenses on Eagle Rock Street be approved:

A bill due the Special Investigator for services rendered in recent clean-up on Eagle Rock Street in the amount of \$136.00 was presented before the Council by Chairman Gourley of the Police Committee. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the bill be allowed and paid. Roll call voting Aye: Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Crowley, Wright; Motion carried.

The following recommendation was presented by the Finance Committee:

Honorable Mayor and City Council
City of Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

We are in receipt of a communication from Anderson Brothers Bank as Trustee for the bondholders of the Idaho Falls Community Hotel Corporation, requesting that the City transmit to them all bonds of said Corporation now owned by the City and to give consent to the following propositions:

- (1) Extension of the maturity dates of these bonds for three years.
- (2) Reduction of the interest due October 1, 1933, from 7 to 3½% and the reduction of the rate of interest accruing due from October 1, 1934, to April 1, 1936, from 7% to 5%.

After giving the matter due consideration we recommend that the City Treasurer be authorized to deliver to the said Anderson Brothers Bank as Trustee, all bonds of the Idaho Falls Community Hotel Corporation now owned by the City for endorsement as provided in items specified above.

The Bank advises that 88% of all outstanding bonds have already been delivered to them for endorsement.

It was moved by Wright, seconded by Wilkie, that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wilkie, Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Crowley, Wright, Evans; Motion carried.

It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the Clerk be instructed to demand a substantial monthly payment each month from the signer of these notes until they are paid in full. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie; Motion carried.

Stanley Crowley, Chairman of the Finance Committee, made a statement to the Council to the effect that open gambling is being permitted, particularly poker games, and asked the Council to pass a motion introduced by him, and recommended by the Finance Committee that the Police Department receive the instructions of the Council to close all such places. It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Wright, that the recommendation of the Finance Committee and the above notion be passed and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree; Motion carried.

The Mayor asked for authority from the Council to sign Mesa Falls power site plans, etc. It was moved by Wilkie, seconded by Ewart, that the Mayor be authorized to sign plans, proofs, etc. on Mesa Falls power project which are to be forwarded to the Federal Power Commission. Roll call voting Aye: Ewart, Gourley, Crowley, Wright, Evans, Wilkie Crabtree, Mehlhoff; Motion carried.

Judge Douglass Hix made application to quite title to certain pieces of property on Basalt Street in old town-site. No action was taken by the Council.

R. M. Talbot presented to the Council a proposition about bill for digging of trench in the amount of \$40.50 which has been turned down twice.

No action was taken by the Council.

It was moved by Crowley, seconded by Crabtree, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wright, Evans, Wilkie, Crabtree, Mehlhoff, Ewart, Gourley, Crowley; Motion carried.
