

AUGUST 15, 1930

The Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Rigby, Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Holmes, Randall, Anderson and Rhule, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Holmes, that the claim of H. P. Neilsen in the sum of \$3,000.00 as first payment on contract for the furnishing and laying of brick for the new City Hall Building be allowed. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following recommendation of the Finance Committee was read:

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Brandl, that the permits be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

An ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SCHEDULE NO. 6 OF ORDINANCE NO. 445, ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SCHEDULE NO. 4 AND SCHEDULE NO. 5 AND AMENDING SCHEDULE NO. 6 OF ORDINANCE NO. 417 OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, RELATING TO AND PROVIDING FOR A SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES FOR ELECTRICITY GENERATED AND SOLD BY THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, FOR DOMESTIC USE, BE AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:-" was read before the Council for the second time by the Clerk. It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Holmes, that the ordinance pass its second reading. Roll call voting aye; Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Holmes and Randall, voting nay; Brandl and Rigby, passing and not voting; Ewart, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Holmes, that the rule of law requiring an ordinance to be read at three separate meetings of the Council be suspended and the ordinance be placed on its third reading. Roll call voting aye; Rhule, Coy, Holmes, Randall and Anderson, voting nay; Brandl and Rigby, passing and not voting; Ewart, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost as it requires a three-fourths majority of the Council to suspend the rule of law.

This being the time set for the opening and considering of bids for the furnishing of steel counter and vault doors for the City Clerk's office in the new City Hall Building, and there having been filed with the City Clerk four bids the Clerk did on order from the Mayor and Council open and read the same. After all proposals had been read the Mayor referred same to the Finance Committee, the Building Committee and the City Clerk for tabulation.

A communication was read asking for permission from the City Council to remove a body from Lot 1, Block 70, Old Part of Rose Hill Cemetery to another part of the cemetery was read and was referred to the Cemetery Committee.

AUGUST 15, 1930

Two petitions were read by the Clerk, one asking that Cleveland Avenue be opened to Highway and one asking that Gladstone Street between Wabash Avenue and Freeman Street be opened for traffic. These petitions were referred to the Street and Ditch Committee.

Three petitions were read by the Clerk, one asking for a street light at the corner of J Street and Lake Avenue, one asking for water extension to Lots 18 to 32, Block 33, and Lots 1 to 17, Block 34, Highland Park addition, and one asking for water extension in other blocks in Highland Park addition, were referred to the Electric Light and Water Committee.

Mr. Rigby reported regarding band concerts and also his findings regarding the 5 acre tract of land adjoining the cemetery.

An invitation from Oakland, California, for the Fire Chief to attend the Annual Fire Convention to be held in that city was read and was ordered filed.

At this time the Mayor appointed O. H. Hansen as City Sanitary Inspector, but no action was taken by the Council.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Coy, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
