The following report of the Airport Committee was read:

July 31, 1930

HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL:
Idaho Falls, Idaho

We, the Airport Committee of the City Council, Idaho Falls, Idaho, do hereby recommend to the City Council that a schedule of rates, charges and tolls for the use of the Idaho Falls Municipal Airport be established, and that the following schedule of rates be adopted and charged:

1. For use of the airport facilities for taking off and landing, except commercial operations or carrying passengers for hire: fifty cents (50¢) per day or any part thereof for each plane and an additional fifty cents per night for each night plane is kept at airport.

2. For a commercial plane carrying passengers for hire or reward as follows:

Two passenger plane, five dollars (\$5.00) per day and \$2.50 in addition thereto for each extra or additional passenger which the plane has capacity to carry; or twenty dollars (\$20.00) per month, for each commercial plane on which rental is paid by the month, which monthly rental shall be paid in advance.

Concessions may be granted temporarily by the Airport Committee to soft drink stands, confectionery stand, hot dog stands, etc., and each user of the airport for such purpose shall pay to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) per day in advance if said concession is for a period of ten (10) days or less. If the concession is granted for a period of thirty (30) days or more, the rental shall be charged and collected at the rate of fifty cents (50¢) per day.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Brandl, that the purchasing agent be authorized to buy from the C. W. & M. Company, 500 feet of Eureka fire hose at \$1.40 per foot. Roll call voting aye; Rhule and Brandl, voting nay; Coy, Holmes and Anderson, absent and not voting; Ewart, Randall and Rigby, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Anderson, that the City Clerk be instructed to advertise for bids on 500 feet of 2½" fire hose. Roll call voting aye; Coy, Holmes and Anderson, voting nay; Brandl and Rhule, absent and not voting; Ewart, Rigby and Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

An application from Roger Bros. Seed Company asking that power and light service be extended to their new warehouse at the end of Chamberlain Avenue was read and it was moved by Rhule, seconded by Coy, that the service be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

A petition asking that an arc light be installed at 12th Street and June Avenue was read and was referred to the Electric Light and Water Committee.

A communication from the Music Committee of the Chamber of Commerce was read and was referred to the Band Committee.

A letter from Ralph Comstock of Nampa regarding the tract of land adjoining Rose Hill Cemetery owned by Mr. Mills of Nampa was read and was referred to the Cemetery Committee.

A communication from W. D. Wilcox was read and was ordered filed.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Anderson, that the City enter into a contract with the Electric Products Company of Great Falls, Montana, for two electric neon signs for the new City Hall building. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

AUGUST 1, 1930

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Rhule, that the City Engineer be authorized to prepare maps and date of Mesa Falls and send same to the United States Power Commission at Washington D.C. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
