

JULY 18, 1930

---

The Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of eight o'clock P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Holmes and Rigby, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

A communication from the Beautification Committee of the Chamber of Commerce asking for a donation of \$50.00 to be used to help sponsor the County flower show was read and it was moved by Rigby, seconded by Anderson, that the City make a donation of \$50.00 to help defray the expenses of the flower show. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Anderson, that the Purchasing Agent be authorized to sign a contract with the Preston A. Blair Company for the purchase of a standard six Sedan for the Police Department. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

A communication from the School Board of Independent School District No. 1 asking the City to furnish the water that was needed for the swimming pool was read and was referred to the Electric Light and Water Committee.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rigby, that the Mayor is hereby authorized to sign on behalf of the City an addendum to a water contract with the Oregon Short Line Railroad Company which extends contract for a period of two years from May 1<sup>st</sup>, 1930. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following applications for building permits were presented:

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the applications be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the Finance Committee is hereby authorized to proceed to negotiate for the purchase of property as recommended by the Finance and Park Committee. Roll call voting aye; Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Ewart and Holmes, voting nay; Brandl, absent and not voting; Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rigby, that the purchasing agent be authorized to offer Mr. Mills of Nampa \$1,000.00 for the five and a fraction acres owned by said Mr. Mills and which joins Rose Hill Cemetery on the southwest. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Holmes, seconded by Rhule, that the purchasing agent is hereby authorized to purchase one car load of heavy asphalt oil for use on the streets. Roll call voting aye; Rhule, Holmes and Rigby, voting nay; Coy, Brandl, Ewart and Anderson, absent and not voting; Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

The following report of the Electric Light and Water Committee was read:

Hon. Mayor and City Council  
Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen,

We, the Electric Light and Water Committee of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, hereby recommend as follows:

Whereas, the gross rate for domestic use for the first 15 kilowatts of electricity consumed in any one month under the present ordinance is fixed at ten cents per KWH, and whereas, we believe this rate is too high. We hereby recommend to the Mayor and City Council that Schedule No. 6 of the Rate Ordinance be amended to provide that the gross rate for the first fifteen KWH consumed in any one month shall be eight cents per KWH instead of ten cents per KWH as now charged.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the report of the Electric Light and Water Committee be adopted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Holmes, seconded by Rhule, that the Ordinance Committee be instructed to prepare an ordinance amending Ordinance #445, incorporating the rate recommended by the Electric Light and Water Committee. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The matter of purchasing a counter to be used in the new office of the City Clerk in the City Hall building was discussed and it was referred to the City Clerk and the Building Committee to decide what was needed.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS #1 AND #2 OF ORDINANCE #446, ENTITLED, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL

APPROPRIATION OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1930-1931 AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS BE AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:-" was read and it was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that the ordinance pass its first reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Rhule, that the rule of law requiring an ordinance to be read at three separate meetings of the Council be suspended and the ordinance be placed on its second reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The necessary three-fourths having voted to suspend the rules, the ordinance was read for the second time, after which it was moved by Anderson, seconded by Holmes, that the ordinance pass its second reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rigby, seconded by Brandl, that the ordinance pass its third and final reading and be finally adopted and approved. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The ordinance was then numbered #447 and was passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Idaho Falls Post, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and having a general circulation therein.

It was then moved by Brandl, seconded by Ewart, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
