We, the Finance Committee of the City Council of Idaho Falls, Idaho, after considering the bill in the sum of Twenty-Two Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars, (\$2,250.00) filed by Attorney Kenneth S. MacKenzie, hereby recommend that in order to avoid litigation and as a compromise settlement in full of said claim, that we pay to the said Kenneth S. MacKenzie the sum of Five Hundred and no/100 Dollars, (\$500.00) in full settlement of said claim.

A communication from Wm. Luxton regarding the condition of the lot adjoining his property of Ridge Avenue was referred to the Street and Ditch Committee.

An application from Earnest M. Pollock for the position as band master was read and was referred to the Band Committee.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that as long as H. P. Nielsen has given the City a bond covering his brick contract with the City that the City Clerk be instructed to return Mr. Nielsen's certified check to him. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

An application of A. H. Rittle for the extension of light and water service was read and was referred to the Electric Light and Water Committee.

The matter of purchasing poles for the Electric Light Department was brought up and it was referred to the Electric Light and Water Committee for further investigation.
