

JUNE 20, 1930

The Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Ewart, Holmes and Rigby, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A claim in the sum of \$2,250.00 in favor of Kenneth McKenzie, for attorney fees in the case of Keefer et al, Vs. the City of Idaho Falls, was read and referred to the Finance Committee.

The following recommendation of the Building Committee was read:

Gentlemen:

We, the Building Committee, having gone into the matter of letting the contract for the furnishing of tiling and placing of same in the City Hall Building hereby recommend that the contract be entered into with the Elias Morris & Sons Co., of Salt Lake City, Utah, at a total cost of \$2,650.00.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that the recommendation of the Building Committee be adopted and that the Mayor and City Clerk be hereby authorized to sign a contact with the Elias Morris & Sons Company on behalf of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time Councilman Brandl entered the meeting and thereafter participated in the proceedings of the Council.

An application for sewer extension in Blocks 7, 8, & 9, Scott's Addition, was read and was referred to the Street and Ditch Committee.

The following copy of a letter which F. L. McGrew, Building Inspector, sent to Mr. E. F. Ellsworth, of Rigby, Idaho, was read:

Dear Sir:

We have been reliably informed that you have been holding boxing matches in the building known as the Dowd-Bucklin Building, on the corner of Park Avenue and B Street, City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, which at times attract a large number of people.

There being but one exit from the assembly hall in the said building, it is very unsafe and dangerous to hold such assemblies; therefore, you are hereby notified to discontinue such assemblies until the necessary exits are installed so as to comply with the building laws of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Coy, that the Council approve the letter as written and that Mr. McGrew be instructed to mail a copy of the letter to the owners of the said building. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

As these permits had been checked and OK'd by the Building Inspector it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the permits be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Holmes, that the application of Albert Fitzpatrick for a permit to erect a soft drink and lunch stand on Park Avenue be rejected. Roll call voting aye; Rhule, Coy, Brandl and Holmes, voting nay; Rigby, Anderson and Ewart, absent and not voting; Randall, where upon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

JUNE 20, 1930

Mr. Rates addressed the Council regarding a water extension outside the City limits, after some discussion the Mayor referred the matter to the Electric Light and Water Committee.

At this time Councilman Rigby and Rhule left the meeting.

It was moved by Holmes, seconded by Coy, that the purchasing agent be hereby authorized and instructed to purchase repairs for the pump at the 10th Street well, from the Layne Bowler Company. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Ewart, that the purchasing agent be instructed to buy some cedar poles for use in the Electric Light Department. Roll call voting aye; Ewart, Anderson, Coy and Brandl, voting nay; Holmes, absent and not voting; Randall, Rigby and Rhule, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Holmes, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
