

MAY 21, 1930

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The Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Ewart, Holmes, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule and Brandl, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

A telegram from the National Title Company of Los Angeles was read and was referred to the Building Committee.

An application for Light and Power service from J. G. Andrew was read and was referred to the Electric Light and Water Committee.

A protest signed by several citizens, protesting against the opening of a water ditch on 19<sup>th</sup> Street was read and referred to the Street and Ditch Committee.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rigby, that the applicants for light and power service on the new line north of town be given the option of either paying their proportionate share of the cost in full or paying the city \$5.00 per month in addition to their regular light and power bills, until the first of January 1931, at which time the unpaid balance becomes due and payable to the City. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following report of the Finance Committee was read:

Gentlemen:

We, the Finance Committee, having gone into the proposition of refunding the City's optional general obligation bonds as proposed by the First Securities Corporation of Ogden, Utah, hereby recommend that the bonds be not refunded at this time since it appears that there would be no saving to the taxpayers.

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It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Brandl, that the report of the Finance Committee be adopted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

Since Mr. H. P. Nielsen had made proper endorsement of the check accompanying his bid on the brick work for the new City Hall, it was moved by Holmes, seconded by Rhule, that that part of the minutes of May 16, 1930 referring to the brick contract be approved. Roll call voting aye; Holmes, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule and Brandl, voting nay; Ewart, absent and not voting; Randall and Coy, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

This being the time stated for the opening of the bids for the furnishing of the terra cotta for the new City Hall Building, the clerk did on instructions from the Mayor open and read the bid of the Northwestern Terra Cotta Company, this being the one and only bid submitted.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the bid of the Northwestern Terra Cotta Company of Denver, to furnish the terra cotta for the new City Hall Building, in the sum of \$10,990.00 be accepted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Brandl, that the Mayor and City Clerk be hereby authorized to sign the contract with the Northwestern Terra Cotta Company, for the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Anderson, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
