

MAY 16, 1930

The Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of eight o'clock P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Rhule, Coy, Brandl, Ewart and Holmes, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Brandl, that the minutes be approved except the part referring to the H. P. Neilson bid, this part not to be approved until such time as he, H. P. Nielsen, gives a check payable to the City. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

These permits have been checked and OK'd by the Building Inspector and it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Brandl, that the permits be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time Councilman Rigby entered and thereafter participated in the proceedings of the Council.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Ewart, that the application of Mr. Eugene Wright asking for an open ditch on 19th Street, for conveying water, be referred to the Street and Ditch Committee and City Attorney and that they be given power to act. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the applications be granted and licenses issued. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

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A communication from A. T. Shane referring to the condition of Legion Drive was read and was referred to the Street and Ditch Committee by the Mayor.

An application for a survey to be made on Bear Avenue was read and was also referred to the Street and Ditch Committee.

A communication from the Anderson Bros. Bank and one from the American National Bank relative to their handling the City's claims was read and was referred to the Finance Committee.

It was moved by Rigby, seconded by Coy, that the City purchase the 5 acres of land owned by C. E. Mills and which joins Rose Hill Cemetery on the west for the least price obtainable, providing funds are available to purchase same. Roll call voting aye; Rhule, Coy, Brandl and Rigby, voting nay; Ewart and Holmes, absent and not voting; Anderson and Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The following report of the Finance Committee was read:

Idaho Falls, May 14, 1930

To the Mayor and the City Council
of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

We, the Finance Committee, having investigated the proposition of providing group life insurance for the City employees hereby recommend as follows:

1st - That the Mayor be authorized to sign an application for a policy of Group Insurance for \$1,000.00 for each of the City employees who are not elective officers and who are the heads of families or have someone other than themselves depending upon their salaries for support.

2nd - That said policy contain a provision whereby any employee not eligible for insurance by reason of being an elective officer or having no dependents may secure the insurance by the payment of the yearly premium in advance.

3rd - That said policy shall contain a provision whereby any new employees of the City shall not be entitled to insurance under the policy until they have been in the employ of the City three months.

4th - That said policy shall be placed with the Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States since it appears that the premiums on this class of insurance are identical with others but that the Equitable have been able to make a greater return in dividends thus reducing the cost to a greater extent than other companies.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rigby, that the report be adopted. Roll call voting aye; Coy, Ewart and Rigby, voting nay; Rhule, Brandl and Holmes, absent and not voting; Randall and Anderson, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

At this time proposals were submitted to the Council for the refunding of \$150,000 more or less of General Obligations bonds from Edward L. Burton & Company, Anderson Bros. Bank and the Central Trust Company. On instructions from the Mayor the City Clerk opened and read the same. After some discussion the Mayor referred the same to the Finance Committee. This committee is to report its findings to the City Council, Wednesday evening, May 21st, 1930.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart that the meeting recess until Wednesday, May 21st, at 8 P.M. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
