

MAY 8, 1930

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The Council met in recess session on the above date at the hour of eight o'clock P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Holmes, Rigby, Anderson and Rhule, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The following recommendation of the Finance Committee was read:

Gentlemen:

We, the Finance Committee of the City of Idaho Falls, respectfully recommend to the Mayor and City Council that the bid of C. S. Crabtree in the sum of Thirty-Eight Thousand, Four Hundred Eighty-Three and 35/100 dollars, (\$38,483.35) on the proposed new City Hall be accepted.

We, further recommend that the bid of Mr. Nielsen for the brick work and laying terra cotta in the sum of Nine Thousand, Seven Hundred Sixty-Eight and 90/100 dollars, (\$9,768.90) be accepted.

Each of the above bids were the lowest bids made.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that the City Attorney be instructed to draw up contracts covering the bids of C. S. Crabtree and H. P. Nielsen and that the Mayor and City Clerk is hereby authorized to sign same on behalf of the City of Idaho Falls. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

Two proposals for group insurance for the City employees were presented; one from the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company and one from the Equitable Life Assurance Society. These two proposals were referred to the Finance Committee.

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It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Coy, that the City Clerk is hereby authorized to make the necessary transfers on the books of the City as recommended by the Purchasing Agent. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Brandl, that Item #7 of the City Budget calling for \$1,500.00 for oil for the streets be struck out. Roll call voting aye; Anderson, Brandl and Ewart, voting nay; Rigby, Rhule, Coy and Holmes, absent and not voting; Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

The budget for the City for 1930-31, prepared by the City Auditor, was read and it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Anderson, that the budget be passed as it now reads. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time councilman Ewart left the meeting.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Anderson, that the City Clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for furnishing the Terra Cotta for the City Hall and Fire Station Building. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Holmes, seconded by Brandl, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
