

APRIL 18, 1930

The Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of eight o'clock P.M.

There were present; Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Ewart and Holmes, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

In the absence of the Mayor the meeting was called to order by President of the Council J. A. Coy.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 4, 1930 and the recess meeting of April 5, 1930, were read and approved by the Council.

The following applications for licenses were read:

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the applications be granted and the licenses issued. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time Mayor Clark and Councilman Brandl entered and thereafter participated in the proceedings of the Council.

As the permits have been checked and OK'd by F. L. McGrew, Building Inspector, it was moved by Holmes, seconded by Rhule, that the permits be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The application of L. M. Owen for a building permit to erect a house on the corner of 9th and Lee Avenue, one room of which residence was to be used for a store, was read. A communication signed by residences of that section protesting against the erection of this building was also read. It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rigby, that this application be rejected. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

APRIL 18, 1930

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Ewart, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the bill of sale for one Ford Roadster with pickup body, motor No. 13702780, to the Smith-Hart Company. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following recommendation of the Electric Light and Water Committee was read;

To the Mayor and the City Council of the
City of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

We, the Electric Light and Water Committee, having investigated the proposition of placing the Idaho Cold Storage Company on a flat rate for water service, hereby recommend that a rate of \$10.00 per month be established for their plant.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Ewart, that the recommendation of the Electric Light and Water Committee be adopted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the Building Inspector, F. L. McGrew, be instructed to check plans for the new City Hall Building and report to the City Clerk, his findings before bids for completion of said building are advertised for. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rigby, that the City Clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for the complete completion of the new City Hall Building on C Street and Shoup Avenue, according to the plans and specifications of the architect, as soon as F. L. McGrew has checked the plans and reported to him. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Holmes, that the Park Committee be authorized to do the best that they see fit with the tourist park for the year 1930. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Coy, that the ½ block of ground belonging to the City and adjoining the Eagle Rock School grounds on the west side, be turned over to the use of the school for the season of 1930, also that a description of this parcel of land be placed on the ballot at the next City election, for the citizens to decide whether the City shall give same to the Independent School Dist. #1, or not. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following recommendation of the Electric Light and Water Committee was read:

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the recommendation of the Electric Light and Water Committee be adopted and that the ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SCHEDULE NO. 4 AND SCHEDULE NO. 5 AND AMENDING SCHEDULE NO. 6 OF ORDINANCE NO. 417 OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, RELATING TO, AND PROVIDING FOR, A SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES FOR ELECTRICITY GENERATED AND SOLD BY THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, FOR DOMESTIC USE." be placed on its first reading. Roll call voting aye; Coy, Ewart, Holmes, Rigby, Anderson and Rhule, absent and not voting; Randall, voting nay; Brandl, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Holmes, that the rule of the law requiring an ordinance be read at three separate meetings of the Council be suspended and the ordinance be passed and approved under the suspension of the rules. Roll call voting aye; Ewart, Holmes, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule and Coy, voting nay; Brandl, absent and not voting; Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The necessary three-fourths having voted to suspend the rules, the ordinance was read for the second time, and it was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that it pass its second reading. Roll call voting aye; Ewart, Holmes, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule and Coy, voting nay; Brandl, absent and not voting; Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Rhule, that the ordinance be placed on its third and final reading, and be finally passed, adopted and approved. Roll call voting aye; Holmes, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy and Ewart, voting nay; Brandl, absent and not voting; Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The ordinance was then numbered No. 445 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Idaho Falls Post, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho and having a general circulation therein.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Anderson, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
