

MARCH 7, 1930

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The Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of eight o'clock P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Ewart, Holmes, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy and Brandl, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The following report and recommendation of the Finance and Parks Committees of the City Council was read:

We, your committees, recommend that the \$6,000.00 allocated for the purchase of parks be now turned over to the Finance Committee of the City Council for the purpose of securing deeds to the following lots in the Original Town of Idaho Falls, via:

- All of Block 63,
- Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 in Block 64,
- All of Block 75,
- Lots 11 and 12 in Block 74,
- Lot 9 in Block 76,
- Hospital easement for 100 ft, way through Block 72.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rigby, that the report and recommendation presented by the Finance and Park Committees be adopted. Roll call voting aye; Rigby, Anderson, Coy, Ewart and Holmes, voting nay; Rhule, passing and not voting; Brandl, absent and not voting; Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the claim be allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the proper funds in payment of same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The two claims of Stephenson Bros., one in the amount of \$1,932.30 and one in the amount of \$2,650.00 were by the Mayor, referred to the Finance Committee for their approval or rejection.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Anderson, that the claim of Mrs. Adelia B. Scott, in the sum of \$125.00, for payment of Lot 6, Block 7, Edgewater Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, be allowed but warrant be held until such time that the City Attorney had passed on the abstract for same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Holmes, seconded by Rhule, that the City Clerk be instructed to issue a duplicate warrant to R. B. Ewart in the sum of \$25.00 to take the place of the warrant #1782 issued to Mr. Ewart of May 18, 1930, which was lost or destroyed. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following reports were read and ordered filed:

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Ewart, that the applications for milk licenses submitted by L. A. Schwabedissen and Elmer Engstrom and OK'd by the Sanitary Inspector be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

A petition was read and signed by several businessmen asking that a light system be installed on Shoup Avenue between B and D Streets, which was referred to the Light and Water Committee.

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An application for water service was read and was referred to the Electric Light and Water Committee.

An application for Superintendent of Parks, signed by W. J. Anderson, was read and referred to the Parks Committee.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Rhule, that the request asking the City to petition Congress to set aside October 11, to be known as General Pulaski's Memorial Day be referred to the Mayor. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Holmes, that the Electric Light and Water Committee and the Purchasing Agent compile a new schedule of light and power rates and that the Ordinance Committee and City Attorney meet with Electric Light and Water Committee to draw up an ordinance covering the new rates and present same to the Council at their next regular meeting. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Holmes, that the Electric Light and Power rate attached hereto be placed in force at the Avalon apartment as a test rate for a period of one month. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that the recommendation of the auditor that the City cancel warrant issued jointly to Carl Moore and the Independent Lumber Company in the sum of \$2,490.00, be carried out and that said warrant is hereby ordered cancelled. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the Airport Committee and Purchasing Agent be authorized and empowered to let the contract for the lighting of the City Airport. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

After a discussion regarding the labor condition existing at the City garage at 10<sup>th</sup> and Boulevard, the Mayor referred the same to the Electric Light and Water Committee and the Street and Ditch Committee instructing them that they have power to rectify the condition existing there.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the Purchasing Agent be authorized and empowered to purchase 2200' of 6" and 250' of 4" cast iron pipe and necessary connections. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Anderson, that the plan of L. E. Fisher covering the new City Hall Building be accepted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Brandl, that the Building Committee and Purchasing Agent be authorized and empowered to purchase steel for reinforcing concrete walls and floors for new City Hall Building. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

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It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the City commence to construct the floor on top of basement walls of the City Hall Building under the bid of Mr. Crabtree of \$5.00 per yard, if funds are available. The Finance Committee and City Attorney to investigate and see if funds are available. Roll call voting aye; Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Holmes and Rhule, passing and not voting; Rigby and Anderson, absent and not voting; Randall.

It was moved by Rigby, seconded by Ewart, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
