

FEBRUARY 7, 1930

---

The Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of eight o'clock P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Brandl, Ewart, Holmes, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule and Coy, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A report of the Sanitary Committee stating their findings concerning the Health unit was read by the Clerk. And after much discussion it was moved by Rhule, seconded by Brandl, that the report of Sanitary Committee be adopted as read. A substitute motion moved by Ewart, seconded by Rigby, stating that the matter of the City helping finance the Rockefeller Health Unit until May 1, 1930, be referred to the Finance Committee and City attorney. That they are to meet with the Bonneville County Commissioners and if a plan can be adopted the City Finance Committee are hereby authorized and empowered to act. Roll call voting aye; Ewart, Holmes, Rigby and Coy, voting nay; Brandl, Anderson and Rhule, absent and not voting; Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

At this time the monthly claims against the City were presented, they had been checked by the Purchasing Agent and OK'd by the Finance Committee, who recommended that they be allowed:

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Holmes, that the claims be allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the proper funds in payment of same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy and seconded by Ewart, that the claim of Burnham Mfg., Company in the sum of \$475.00 be allowed and warrant be drawn on the Electric Light Fund in payment of same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Holmes, that the bill presented to the City from Bonneville County in the sum of \$2,500.00 for the health unit be placed upon the table. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The annual report of Fire Chief Marker was read by the Clerk and it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Brandl, that the Clerk place this report in each local newspaper as news item if papers will accept it as same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The above applications having been checked by the Sanitary Inspector, it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the applications be granted and the licenses issued. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

Two reports on the water in the new well and one report on the old well were read and ordered filed.

A petition signed by the citizens residing in the north end of town, asking for electric light service was read and same was referred to the Electric Light and Water Committee by the Mayor.

A petition was read which was signed by several farmers living north of Idaho Falls, soliciting light and power service. It was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that arrangements be made as soon as possible to give said applicants the service asked for. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Ewart, that Mrs. L. E. Clifford, 345 E. 20<sup>th</sup> Street, be given free light and water. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

An ordinance entitled, "AMENDING CHAPTER XXIII OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, BY INSERTING THEREIN IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING SECTION 441, A NEW SECTION DESIGNATED SECTION 441-A PROVIDING FOR THE ELECTRICAL WIRING OF NEW HOUSES AND NEW ELECTRICAL WIRING IN PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND BUILDINGS USED FOR BUSINESS PURPOSES" was read by the Clerk and it was moved by Holmes, seconded by Coy, that the ordinance pass its second reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was then moved by Rhule, seconded by Coy, that the rule of law requiring an ordinance to be read at three separate meetings of the Council be suspended and the ordinance be placed on its third reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The necessary three-fourths having voted to suspend the rules, the ordinance was read for the third time, after which it was moved by Holmes, seconded by Rhule, that the ordinance pass its third reading and be finally passed, adopted and approved. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The ordinance was then numbered No. 444 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Idaho Falls Post, the official newspaper for the City of Idaho Falls, and having a general circulation therein.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the bill of the East Idaho Gas Company, in the amount of \$300.00 as presented to the Council at a previous meeting, be referred to the City Attorney, and that he be hereby authorized and empowered to make a settlement with said Alvin Denman, Receiver of the East Idaho Gas Company, if settlement could be made for the sum of \$50.00 or less. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rigby, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
