

JANUARY 17, 1930

The Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8:00 P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Holmes, Randall, Anderson, Rhule and Coy, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The following applications for rooming house licenses were read:

Helen Keyes	365 Eagle Rock

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Holmes, that the applications be granted and the licenses issued. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The water analysis from the Department of Public Welfare was read and ordered filed.

A communication from C. E. Mills of Nampa, Idaho, relative to property adjoining the cemetery was read and referred to the Park and Cemetery Committee.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rhule, that the recommendation of the Subway and Railroad crossing committee, be accepted and fully endorsed by the Council, and that same is to be placed in hands of the City attorney and he is to notify the O. S. L. Railroad Co. of the action taken by the council and if the railroad company does not do something to improve the condition at Subway that complaint will be placed with State Utilities Commission. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time Councilman Rigby entered and thereafter participated in the proceedings of the Council.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Coy, that the Byron Jackson Company be instructed to ship the pumping equipment as early as possible. Roll call voting aye; Rhule, Coy, Holmes and Rigby, voting nay; Randall and Anderson, absent and not voting; Ewart and Brandl, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Report was made by the Purchasing Agent, Mr. Peters, on analysis of samples of water taken from new well and sent to the Department of Public Welfare at Boise. The report being that the water was equal to any they had tested.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rhule, that the Electric Light and Water Committee be hereby authorized and empowered to accept the new well in the north part of town, release and

make settlement with Stephenson Bros., and that the City Engineer is to act with the committee. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rhule, that the Purchasing Agent be given authority to purchase enough wire and equipment to connect the new well with the City power plant down town. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time an ordinance entitled, "AMENDING CHAPTER XXIII OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, BY INSERTING THEREIN IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING SECTION 441, A NEW SECTION DESIGNATED AS SECTION 441-A, PROVIDING FOR THE ELECTRICAL WIRING OF NEW HOUSES AND NEW ELECTRICAL WIRING IN PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND BUILDINGS USED FOR BUSINESS PURPOSES."

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Coy, that the ordinance pass its first reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Randall, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
