

DECEMBER 6, 1929

The City Council met on the above date at the hour of 8:00 P.M. in regular session.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Brandl, Holmes and Randall, absent; Ewart, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rhule, that the expense of the Electric Extension in the amount of \$1,244.50 be paid out of the Electric Light Fund. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Coy, that the above claims be allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the proper funds in payment of same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Randall, seconded by Rhule, that the claim of Hazel A. Wilford in the sum of \$66.37 for services as a nurse in the taking of throat cultures be allowed. Roll call voting aye; Holmes, Randall, Rigby and Rhule, voting nay; Brandl and Anderson, absent and not voting; Ewart, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and warrant ordered drawn in payment of same.

The following resolution was presented by Councilman Rigby:

DECEMBER 6, 1929

Resolved that the City Council is in favor of acquiring the property west side of Memorial Drive, providing same can be purchased for a reasonable figure. The above resolution or motion made by Councilman Rigby was lost for the want of a second.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Brandl, that the purchase of property on the west side of Memorial Drive be referred to the Finance Committee and City Attorney for further investigation, said committee to report at the next regular meeting. Roll call voting aye; Randall, Rigby, Rhule and Brandl, voting nay; Anderson, Coy and Holmes, absent and not voting; Ewart, whereupon the Mayor then declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Rhule, that L. E. Fisher be paid the sum of \$1,500.00 as part payment for services rendered. Roll call voting aye; Anderson, Rhule, Coy and Brandl, voting nay; Rigby, Holmes and Randall, absent and not voting; Ewart, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

The claim of Alvin Denman, Receiver for the Idaho Gas Company, was read and the Mayor referred same to the City Attorney.

It was moved by Randall, seconded by Holmes, that tax statements on City properties be referred to the Purchasing Agent for his investigation and approval, with power to authorize payment of same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Coy, that the above applications be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

A petition signed by a number of citizens, petitioning the City Council to have the Stock Yards of the Oregon Short Line Railroad Company moved from its present location, as it was deemed very unsanitary and make a menace to public health. This matter was referred to the Sanitary Committee.

An application from Mr. Wareham for extension of water was presented and same was referred to the Light and Water Committee.

At this time Mr. C. M. Grissom presented the following resolution:

“Whereas, S Bill 476 and H R Bill 2562 now pending in Congress of these United States, and which bills if enacted into a law, will allow pensions and increases to soldiers, sailors, marines and nurses of the war with Spain, the Philippine Insurrection and China Relief Expedition; and

Whereas, this proposed legislation is meritorious and desirable,

Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, request that due consideration be given to such proposed legislation, to the end that the said measure be enacted into a law as proper recognition of the patriotic service of the intended beneficiaries.”

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Brandl, that the above resolution be adopted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Holmes, that the City Clerk is instructed to return to the Byron-Jackson Pump Company the certified check, given by them in favor of the City in the sum of \$750.00. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Holmes, seconded by Rhule, that the recommendation of the Finance Committee regarding the transfer of certain items of expense from one fund to another be adopted, and the City Clerk is instructed to transfer same on the books of the city. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Brandl, that the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company be permitted to store poles on the City’s property at west end of Paulson Street, between present spur to Thomas Bros. Elevator and railway right-of-way fence. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rigby, seconded by Rhule, that Mr. Andy Keefer is authorized to cut down all cottonwood trees growing along the east fence of the cemetery; that Mr. Keefer agrees to cut down and move away said trees and all debris, caused by the cutting and trimming, without any expense whatever to the City of Idaho Falls. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Rhule, that the Council does hereby authorize the construction of that part of the City Hall building designated in the plans as Police Sergeant quarters. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Anderson, that the quarterly audit of the Van Dusen Auditing Company of the City's finances be accepted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Randall, seconded by Holmes, that the City Clerk is instructed to notify all bondholders of Improvement District Bonds of the action taken by the County Commissioners in selling parcels of property for delinquent State and County Taxes. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rigby, seconded by Coy, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
