

NOVEMBER 15, 1929

The City Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8:00 P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Randall, absent; Holmes, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

At this time Councilman Holmes entered the meeting and thereafter participated in the Council proceedings.

Mrs. Walter Pettinger addressed the Council in behalf of the Ladies Welfare Committee in an appeal for improvement of the Ladies Rest Room. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that this matter be referred to the Sanitary and Finance Committee with power to act. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The Council was addressed by Mr. O. A. Johannesen on City Beautification, for the purchase of land on the west side of Memorial Drive for City park purposes. The Mayor referred same to the Finance and Park Committees to work with a committee of the American Legion and City Attorney and make report on same as soon as possible.

The Finance Committee presented the following claims which had been checked by the Purchasing Agent and OK'd by them and recommended that the same be allowed:

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that the above claims be allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the proper funds in payment of same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following building permits were presented:

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Brandl, that the above permits be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The bond of Byron Jackson was read by the Clerk. The Mayor ordered same to be filed.

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The following report was read:

Idaho Falls, Idaho
November 15, 1929

“To the Mayor and City Council
Idaho Falls, Idaho

We, the Electric Light & Water Committee, hereby recommend that the ordinance governing the requirements for electric wiring be so amended that all service entering houses be placed in rigid iron conduit from the outside wall into a steel switch meter box, the same to be effective on all new installations at the expense of the property owner, and that as soon as practicable, all such services on old installations be so wired at the expense of the City. Also that all wiring in the business district, and all public buildings regardless of location within the City, such as churches, schools, hospitals, apartment houses, service stations, stores, garages, etc., be placed in rigid iron conduit in all new installations; and that the Ordinance Committee draft an amendment to the ordinances to cover the above recommendations.

It was moved by Holmes, seconded by Ewart, that the recommendation of the Light and Water Committee be accepted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Ewart, that the Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to sign the permit with the O. S. L. Railroad Company allowing the City to cross railroad track with poles and wire for airport purposes. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that L. E. Fisher be allowed the sum of \$1,500.00 to apply on claim. Roll call voting aye; Anderson, Rhule, Coy and Ewart, voting nay; Holmes, Randall, Rigby and Brandl, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Holmes, that the Clerk notify Mr. L. e. Fisher to present his claim to the City in full at the next regular meeting. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

Mr. Burroughs addressed the Council on refunding of bonds. It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that same be referred to the Finance Committee with the power to act. Roll call voting aye; Ewart, Rhule, Anderson, Rigby, Holmes and Coy, passing; Brandl and Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

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Dr. T. C. Willson addressed the Council regarding the balance of meningitis cases and it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that Dr. Willson is given the power to act and make necessary arrangements with Bacteriologist to care for cases showing up in the City. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
