

NOVEMBER 1, 1929

The City Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8:00 P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Holmes, Randall, absent; Rigby, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. At this time Councilman Rigby entered the meeting and thereafter participated in the Council proceedings.

Mr. A. O. Andelin addressed the Council in behalf of the radio dealers and fans soliciting the City to purchase a trouble finding machine so that a great deal of radio trouble now existing could be eliminated. The Mayor appointed the Electric Light and Water Committee to meet with a committee of radio dealers and report at the meeting on Monday.

At this time the Captain of the Salvation Army addressed the Council making an appeal for a contribution of \$500.00 to be used for charitable purposes that do not come to the attention of other churches or charitable organizations. The Mayor referred this matter to the Finance Committee and give a report on same Monday.

Jack W. Duckworth appealed to the City for a portion of its advertising funds, stating that he thought a reasonable amount would be \$50.00 per month, to be used at the local radio station for advertising purposes. This matter was referred to the Finance Committee to be reported on at the next regular meeting, November 15, 1929.

At this time Mr. Clarence Van Dusen of the Van Dusen Auditing Company addressed the Council calling their attention to the present bookkeeping system in the Clerk's office, and recommended the installation of a new system which he stated had been adopted by a great many corporations in the state and elsewhere and which would cost from \$150.00 to \$200.00 to install.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rigby, that the Van Dusen Auditing Company is instructed to set up a complete bookkeeping system as recommended for the Clerk's office. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following reports were read and ordered filed:

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the claim of W. D. Rogers in the sum of \$150.00 for excavating basement of City Hall be paid. Roll call voting aye; Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Ewart, Holmes, Randall, voting nay; Brandl, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

NOVEMBER 1, 1929

The bond given in favor of the City of Idaho Falls by the Byron-Jackson Company was referred to the Finance Committee.

At this time an application for excess power from the Shattuck Irrigation Company was read. The Mayor referred same to the Electric Light & Water Committee.

The following report was read:

Idaho Falls, Idaho
November 1, 1929

“To the Mayor and City Council:

We, the Fire Committee of the City Council of Idaho Falls, Idaho, respectfully recommend to the Mayor and City Council that the City lease from the American La-France Company, the following described property:

One Type 14-75 American La-France 750 gallon pumping engine ladder truck and hose motor car; ladder equipment to be standard 235' Suite;

and pay therefore as rental the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) when said fire truck is delivered, and execute an Option Contract to purchase the same for the sum of Thirteen Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$13,850.00), plus interest on deferred payments; the amount paid as rental to be credited on the purchase price.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Rhule, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the contract for the City with the American La-France and Foamite Industries, Inc. of Elmira, New York, for the purchase of Fire Fighting equipment, as specified in contract read before the Council. Roll call voting aye; Anderson, Rhule and Brandl, passing; Coy and Randall, voting nay; Ewart, Holmes and Rigby, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

A bid from W. D. Rogers for grading and leveling airport field was read but no action was taken on same.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Brandl, that the recommendation of the Airport Committee that the contract for leveling and grading of the airport field be let to W. L. Peeler at the price of 65¢ per yard. Roll call voting aye; Brandl, Ewart, Randall, Rigby and Anderson, voting nay; Rhule and Coy, passing; Holmes, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

NOVEMBER 1, 1929

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Brandl, that the application of the Paramount Theater for license be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Holmes, that we do now recess until Monday, November 4, 1929, at 8 o'clock P.M.
