It was moved by Randall, seconded by Rigby, that the above permits be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

A report of Claude Black, City Engineer, on cost of construction of sidewalks on Legion Drive and First Street was referred to the City Attorney.

A communication from A. T. Shane calling attention to having sidewalks put in on Legion Drive was read and same was referred to the City Attorney.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Holmes, that the bond of Harry Changnon be cancelled. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time an application was read from the Independent Lumber & coal Company of Idaho Falls and the Idaho Japanese Association requesting permission to build a railroad spur on the following described property:

Extends from the north side of First Street through one and one-half blocks to the alley between Lomax and Gladstone Streets, in about the middle of the block running from Lee Avenue to the Oregon Short Line right-of-way:  
Also, the east twenty (20) lots of the block bounded by First Street, Lee Avenue and Lomax Street.

Said request to be granted to the Independent or the Idaho Japanese Association or jointly for both as decided between them.

It was moved by Randall, seconded by Holmes, that the above request be granted. Roll call voting aye; Holmes, Randall, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy and Brandl, absent and not voting; Ewart, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Randall, that the recommendation of the Ordinance Committee to amend Section No. 751 be passed at its first reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Randall, that the Grice Roofing Company bid No. 1 for \$503.50 for a building on Boulevard be accepted. Roll call voting aye; Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Brandl, Holmes and Randall, passing; Coy, absent and not voting; Ewart, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The Mayor appointed City Engineer Claude Black and Street and Ditch Committee to meet with Mr. Shattuck and Mr. Cotton regarding the sidewalk on C Street.

The Mayor appointed the Light & Water Committee to investigate the light bills of the Eastern Idaho Loan and Trust Company.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Rhule, that the Purchasing Agent be instructed to purchase 500 feet of 2 ½ inch fire hose. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Anderson, that fire bell be placed in position on bell tower of Fire Station Building. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The Mayor appointed Rigby, Rhule and Holmes to investigate the skating rink.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Anderson, that we do now adjourn.
