The City Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8:00 P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Holmes, Randall and Rigby; absent none, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and it was moved by Anderson, seconded by Randall, that that part of the minutes stating at this time Randall, Anderson and Brandl walked out of said meeting, and all proceedings taking place after that be stricken out. Roll call voting aye; Randall, Anderson and Brandl, voting nay; Ewart, Holmes, Rigby, Rhule and Coy, absent and not voting; none, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost and that the minutes approved as read.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the applications of Floyd Hayball and Ernest Bates for Electricians license be granted, providing Bonds were filled with the City within the next week. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Brandl, that the City of Idaho Falls do hereby release The Fidelity and Deposit Company of Maryland from all liability for future acts of F. T. Norton, Patrolman, City Police, Idaho Falls; this release to date from May 1<sup>st</sup>, 1929. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Holmes, that the City buy a piece of property situate northwest of town for gravel pit for the sum of \$300.00, as reported by Councilmen Randall and Anderson. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time the Mayor appointed the Street and Ditch Committee to investigate the property joining the dump grounds on the west of present dump site and report at next meeting.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Randall, that the Purchasing Agent be instructed to buy 5 Bessemmer Steel doors and window guards of Tool Proof Steel. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At the time Councilman Ewart left the meeting.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Brandl, that the City Attorney be instructed to cooperate with the County Prosecuting Attorney and see what could be done regarding the closing of stores on Sunday. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The Mayor appointed the Building Committee to meet with Charles Wierman and see if a satisfactory price could be arrived at for the purchase of lots on Tenth Street joining City property.

It was moved by Rigby, seconded by Holmes, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
