

AUGUST 17, 1929

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The City Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8:00 P.M.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Holmes, Randall, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Brandl and Ewart, absent; none, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Finance Committee presented the following list of claims which had been checked by the Purchasing Agent and OK'd by them and recommended that the same be allowed:

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the above claims be allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the proper funds in payment of same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the claim of Walter Langseth in the amount of \$18.50 be referred to the City Attorney. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Coy, that the claim of A. A. Smith be referred to the Building Committee. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Randall, seconded by Holmes, that the following patrolmen's bonds be accepted:

The above having been approved by the Building Inspector, it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the above permits be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time Mrs. M. B. Yeaman addressed the Council regarding the Health Unit appropriation stating that the County had set aside \$1,600 for the balance of the year, or until January 1, 1930, and that the County had also set aside in their budget \$2,500.00 for 1930. She also stated that a doctor was ready to leave Washington D.C. to take charge of the work here as soon as funds were available, and she would like to know what the City was going to do regarding same.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the City appropriate \$1,500.00 in cash and also furnish a car, now used by the Sanitary Inspector, as their proportionate share to the Rockfellers County Health Unit until May 1<sup>st</sup>, 1930. Roll call voting aye; Holmes, Rigby, Rhule, Coy, Brandl and Ewart, voting nay; Randall, Anderson and Brandl, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

At this time Councilmen Anderson, Randall and Brandl left the meeting.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign the contract of The Burnham Manufacturing Company to furnish headgates at the power plant. Roll call voting aye; Rhule, Coy, Ewart, Holmes and Rigby, absent and not voting; Anderson, Brandl and Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

At this time Councilman Rigby stated that the next meeting of the Council, either special or regular, we would move for a reconsideration of the Health Unit appropriation as he thought the Council acted a little hasty in passing the appropriation, as it should have been referred back to the Sanitary Committee for their investigation and recommendations.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Coy, that the Purchasing Agent be instructed to purchase enough brick to face building on Boulevard and Tenth Street at the well. Roll call voting aye; Coy, Ewart, Holmes, Rigby and Rhule, absent and not voting; Brandl, Randall and Anderson, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that the City Clerk notify property owners on First Street, Legion Drive and Emerson School District to build sidewalks on their respective property, a list of properties to be submitted to the Clerk by the City Engineer, Claude R. Black. Roll call voting aye; Ewart, Holmes, Rigby, Rhule and Coy, absent and not voting; Brandl, Randall and Anderson, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

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It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Holmes, that the meeting do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
