It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rhule, that the bill as presented by the Fobes Supply Company of Butte, Montana, in the sum of \$1,585.24 for supplies be allowed. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the bill of W. D. Rogers in the sum of \$15.00 for hauling 60 yards of gravel be allowed. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The claim of Wm. Rogers in the sum of \$266.37 was referred to the Finance Committee.

The claim of the Idaho Falls Electric Company in the sum of \$199.00 was also referred to the Finance Committee.

We, the Electric Light & Water Committee, having investigated working conditions and salaries of the operators of the Electric Light Plant, hereby recommend that Charles McAllister, Wallace Heath, and Howard Cole be placed on a salary of \$160.00 per month beginning with July 1, 1929.

The following report was read:

“To the Honorable Mayor and City Council
Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

We, the Electric Light & Water Committee, hereby recommend that Wyatt Hill be designated as Plumbing Inspector, in connection with his duties as Superintendent of Water Works; that Ray Moore be designated as Wire Inspector, in connection with his duties as Line Foreman in the Electric Light Department; and, that F. L. McGrew be designated as Building Inspector at a salary of \$75.00 per month beginning with July 1, 1929. Also that the Building Inspector be required to make at least four inspections of each building, as follows: two during construction; one on completion; and one when all light and plumbing fixtures have been installed.

It was moved by Randall, seconded by Brandl, that the report be accepted. Roll call voting aye; Randall, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Brandl and Holmes, voting nay; Ewart, absent and not voting; none, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Rigby, that Mr. F. L. McGrew be instructed to notify the Electrician and Water Master of all buildings under construction in order that same may be inspected. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

A letter was received from Attorneys Witty and Anderson regarding an assignment of Stephenson Bros. in favor of the National Surety Company. This matter was referred to the City Attorney.

A letter received from Mr. G. G. Wright regarding the leasing of the building now occupied by the City at the corner of Broadway and Capital was read and referred to the Building Committee.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Brandl, that the bid of Fred Case in the sum of \$400.00 per month for the removal of all garbage and taking care of the City dump ground, as specified in Garbage contract, be accepted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time an ordinance entitled "RELATING TO THE PLANTING, PRUNING, GENERAL CARE AND SUPERVISION OF SHRUBS AND TREES GROWING IN THE PARKS AND PARKING AND ON OTHER LANDS CONTROLLED BY THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO" was presented, and the same having previously passed on first reading, it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the ordinance pass its second reading. Roll call voting aye; Brandl, Ewart, Holmes, Randall, Rigby and Rhule, voting nay; Anderson and Coy, absent and not voting; none, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

An application for position as watchman at the new City Well when completed was received from Russell Homer and same was referred to Light & Water Committee.

At this time an ordinance entitled "PROVIDING FOR A SUPERINTENDENT OF PARKS AND OTHER LANDS BELONGING TO THE CITY, PRESCRIBING HIS DUTIES, AND FIXING THE SALARY OF SUCH OFFICER" was presented and after the same had been read in full by the Clerk, it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the ordinance pass its first reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following application for building permit was read:

It was moved by Randall, seconded by Anderson, that the above permit be granted. Roll call voting aye; Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Holmes, Randall, Rigby and Anderson, voting nay; Rhule, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The application for position to look after dump grounds was received from A. Booth and same was referred to Sanitary Committee.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rigby, that the City Council go on record as supporting the Sanitary Inspector regarding open toilets and bad plumbing. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rhule, seconded by Rigby, that the City Attorney be instructed to have the property of Mrs. Bean condemned and to notify Mrs. Bean that this will be done unless property is improved immediately. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that the City Attorney and a committee of three, appointed by the Mayor, be instructed to communicate with the Board of County Commissioners to determine what arrangements can be made regarding the obtaining of a lease on the acres of ground situated west and north of the City and known as the Airport Sight. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Brandl, that in the future all vouchers must be countersigned by the Purchasing Agent only and not by him until they have been OK'd by the heads of the different departments. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

JULY 5, 1929

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Rigby, that neither the Mayor, any member of the City Council or the heads of the different departments be permitted to hire any extra help until they get the approval of two members of the committee within whose jurisdiction such work is to be done. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Brandl, that the request of the Fire Chief to attend the Fireman's Convention at Vancouver B.C. be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

A financial report given by Clark B. Moon was referred to the Finance Committee.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Anderson, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
