Rogers for the removal of the Old Fire Station Building and also to consider claim of C. T. Edwards.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Brandl, Holmes and Randall, absent; Ewart, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The following ordinance was then introduced and read in full by the Clerk: "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1929 AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS".

It was moved by Randall, seconded by Coy, that the rule of law requiring and ordinance be read at three separate meetings of the Council be suspended and the ordinance placed on first

reading. Roll call voting aye; Coy, Brandl, Holmes, Randall, Rigby, Anderson, Rhule, absent and not voting; Ewart, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the rules suspended.

The Clerk again read the ordinance in full and it was moved by Coy, seconded by Rhule, that the ordinance pass its first reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The Clerk again read the ordinance in full and it was moved by Holmes, seconded by Rigby, that the ordinance pass its second reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The Clerk again read the ordinance in full and it was moved by Randall, seconded by Brandl, that the ordinance pass its third and final reading and be finally passed, adopted and approved. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The said ordinance was then numbered Ordinance #439 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, in the presence of the City Council, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Idaho Falls Daily Post, the official paper of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho and having a general circulation therein.

It was moved by Holmes, seconded by Rhule, that the contract with W. D. Rogers be approved, subject to the amendment that all brick be cleaned. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
