

JUNE 7, 1929

The City Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8:00 p.m.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, Harry H. Payne, City Clerk, and Councilmen Rhule, Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Randall, Rigby and Anderson, absent; Holmes, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

At this time Councilman Holmes entered and thereafter participated in the proceedings of the Council.

The matter of extending the poles, etc. for electric service to the George Wareham residence on Capital Hill Addition was discussed and referred to the Light & Water Committee.

All of the above having been approved by the Building Inspector, it was moved by Randall, seconded by Ewart, that the permits be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The above having been approved by the Police Committee, it was moved by Rhule, seconded by Ewart, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Rhule, that all bids on the garbage contract be referred to the Finance Committee and City Attorney. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The bids received on auditing from Clark B. Moon and C. VanDusen were referred to the Finance Committee.

At this time Mayor Clark appointed Mr. Al Heslop as Sexton of the cemetery.

It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Rigby, that this appointment of Al Heslop as Sexton of the cemetery be confirmed. Roll call voting aye; Rigby, voting nay; Anderson, Rhule, Coy, Brandl, Ewart, Holmes and Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion lost.

At this time Mr. Parley Rigby tendered his resignation as Chairman of Parks and the Cemetery Committee but his resignation was not accepted by the Council.

Mayor Clark then appointed Raymond Hanson as bandmaster. It was moved by Coy, seconded by Randall, that this appointment of Mr. Raymond Hanson as Bandmaster be confirmed by the Council. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The Building Committee composed of Ewart, Brandl and Coy reported that they were in favor of proceeding with the work on the second unit of the new City Hall. However no action was taken by the Council.

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Brandl, that all traffic lights be turned on at 8 o'clock A.M. and to be kept lighted until such time at night that the traffic demands same to be turned off, excepting the signal at the corner of Broadway and Cottage Avenue which is to be on continuously during the tourist season. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Holmes, that the Chief of Police be instructed to enforce the law on gambling and bootleg traffic. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Rigby, seconded by Coy, that the meeting do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
