

APRIL 19, 1929

The City Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8:00 p.m.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, E. R. Underhill, City Clerk, and Councilmen Shippen, Coy, Driscoll, Ewart, Holmes, Randall, Schwarz, absent; Shattuck, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The claim of Wilford Woodhouse in the amount of \$250.00 for right-of-way for the diversion of Sage Creek at the new power house was presented and it was moved by Holmes, seconded by Coy, that the claim be allowed out of the Electric Light Fund and warrant be delivered to Mr. Woodhouse of filing with the City Clerk a proper easement or deed approved by the City Attorney. Roll call voting aye; Schwarz, Shippen, Coy, Driscoll, Holmes and Randall, voting aye; Ewart, absent and not voting; Shattuck, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The report of the Department of Public Welfare covering four samples of well water was read and ordered filed.

A communication from John Holste requesting a special rate on water to be used in a proposed cold storage plant was read and referred to the Light and Water Committee.

Charles N. Lee appeared before the Council on behalf of himself and other residents of the vicinity of Third and Higby and requested that an arc light be installed on that corner. After consideration, it was moved by Schwarz, seconded by Randall, that the request be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The matter of proposed water main extension to the property of John J. Lake was discussed, and it was moved by Schwarz, seconded by Coy, that this be referred back to the Light and Water Committee with power to act. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Shippen, seconded by Ewart, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
