

APRIL 10, 1929

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The Council met on the above date at the hour of 7:30 p.m. in regular recess session in accordance with the recess taken on April 5<sup>th</sup>, 1929. There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, E. R. Underhill, City Clerk, and Councilmen Randall, Shattuck, Shippen, Coy, Driscoll, Ewart and Holmes, absent; Schwarz, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The claim of C. Van Dusen in the amount of \$504.55 was presented and it was moved by Randall, seconded by Driscoll, that the claim be allowed. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following report was read:

“To the Honorable Mayor and City Council  
Idaho Falls, Idaho

We, the Electric Light and Water Committee, hereby recommend that the channel for the diversion of Sage Creek, at the new Power Plant be made around the ridge of rock, through the land of Mr. Woodhouse, as shown by the plat submitted by Claude R. Black, Supervising Engineer, and that the work shall be done under the agreement made by this committee with the Progress Canal Company at the agreed price of 20 cents per yard.

Respectfully submitted with the understanding to pay Mr. Woodhouse \$250.00 for the Right-of-Way.

It was moved by Holmes, seconded by Driscoll, that the report be adopted. Roll call resulted as follows: voting aye; Coy, Driscoll, Holmes and Randall, voting nay; Shattuck, Shippen and Ewart; absent; Schwarz, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried. Councilmen Shattuck, Shippen, and Ewart entered protest against the ruling of the Mayor on the above roll call.

At this time V. Can Dusen read to the Council his report covering the financial transactions of the City from May 1<sup>st</sup>, 1927, to March 31<sup>st</sup>, 1929, inclusive.

There having been filed a petition containing the names of voters totaling more than 10% of the total vote cast for Mayor in the last City election, which petition was made and filed in accordance with Chapter 47 of the 1927 Session Laws, it was moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that the City Clerk be authorized and ordered to place on the ballot for the coming general City election the following question:

“Shall a tax of not exceeding two mills be levied each year for the purpose of furnishing a bond fund?” Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

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At this time there was had a general discussion of the municipal airport which was entered into by the Mayor, Mrs. Rates, Joseph Morley and W. R. Walker of the National Parks Airway. It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Shippen that the required amount be placed in the budget for 1929 to commence the improvement of the airport. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Coy, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

Passed and approved this 19<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1929.
