It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Driscoll, that the claims be allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the proper funds in payment of the same. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The claim of C. H. Williams in the amount of \$34.50 was presented without recommendation of the Finance Committee and after consideration it was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Coy, that the claim be allowed in the amount of \$10.00 and if the same will be accepted by the claimant that warrant be ordered drawn on the electric light fund in payment. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The claim of the Idaho Falls Transfer Company in the amount of \$4.75 was presented without recommendation of the Finance Committee, and after discussion it was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Shippen, that the claim be allowed in the amount of seventy-five cents and if the same will be accepted by the claimant that warrant be ordered drawn on the electric light fund in payment. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The above having been approved by the Building Inspector, it was moved by Ewart, seconded by Driscoll, that the permits be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

A communication from George W. Edgington making demand upon the City for alleged injury to Sabra Roberts in the amount of \$500.00, which injury she claims to have suffered on February 8, 1929, while passing through the subway, was read and after discussion, it was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Shippen, that the same be not allowed for reason that the action occurred on the property of the Oregon Short Line Company and not on City property. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

MARCH 1, 1929

A. T. Shane appeared before the Council regarding the condition of the Legion Drive. It was moved by Schwarz, seconded by Driscoll, that the matter be referred to the City Engineer for report on March 15, 1929. It was then moved by Shattuck, seconded by Ewart, as a substitute motion that the City Attorney requests the County Commissioners to arrange for the paving of Legion Drive at the earliest possible date. Roll call voting aye; Ewart, Shattuck, Shippen, Coy and Driscoll, voting nay; Schwarz, absent and not voting; Holmes and Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Councilman Ewart opened discussion on the need of single meter rates for domestic services and the use of conduits and steel meter box for all new installations. It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Ewart, that the City Clerk, City Electrician and Purchasing Agent be authorized to work out a single meter rate for domestic service. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Schwarz, that the City Electrician furnish the Ordinance Committee the necessary data on which to draw an ordinance to require the use of conduit and steel fuse and meter box for all new installations. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Schwarz, seconded by Driscoll, that all laborers on City work be paid on the following schedule: Single hands 50 cents per hour; man and team \$6.50 per day of eight hours. Roll call voting aye; Driscoll, Ewart, Schwarz and Shippen, voting nay; Shattuck, passing; Coy, absent and not voting; Holmes and Randall, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Ewart, that the Street Commissioner be ordered to require all men in his employ to attend to their work or discharge them. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Ewart, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
