

FEBRUARY 21, 1929

The Council met on the above date at the hour of 2:30 o'clock P.M. pursuant to the following call:

To W. L. Shattuck, J. A. Coy, W. P. Holmes, Frank Randall, R. B. Ewart, Fred Driscoll, H. Schwarz and Carl Shippen, Councilmen of said City:

Please take notice that I have called a special meeting of the City Council of said City to be held at the City Council rooms on the 21st of February, 1929, at 2:30 o'clock P.M. for the purpose of fixing the salaries of the elective and appointive officers of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, as provided under Section 31 of the Compiled Ordinances and amendments thereto, also Chapter 17 of the 1925 Session Laws.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, E. R. Underhill, City Clerk, and Councilmen Schwarz, Shippen, Coy, Driscoll, Ewart and Randall, absent; Shattuck and Holmes, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The proposed salaries for the fiscal year 1929 to 1931 were discussed and the following action taken:

It was moved by Schwarz, seconded by Driscoll, that the salary of the Mayor be fixed at \$2100.00 per annum. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Schwarz, seconded by Coy, that the salaries of Councilmen be fixed at \$480.00 per annum each. Roll call voting aye; Shippen, Coy, Driscoll, Ewart and Schwarz, voting nay; Randall, absent and not voting Holmes and Shattuck, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

FEBRUARY 21, 1929

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Shippen, that the salaries of Police patrolmen be fixed as follows: First Class, \$1980.00 per annum; Second Class, \$1860.00 per annum; Third Class, \$1740.00 per annum; special, \$1680.00 per annum. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following ordinance was then introduced and read in full by the Clerk:

“AN ORDINANCE FIXING AND REGULATING THE SALARIES OF THE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, FOR THE TERM 1929 TO 1931; PROVIDING FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES, REGULATING AND FIXING THEIR SALARIES, FIXING THE TIME AT WHICH NEWLY ELECTED OFFICERS SHALL ASSUME THE DUTIES OF THEIR RESPECTIVE OFFICES, PROVIDING FOR THE BONDING OF ALL OFFICERS OF SAID CITY AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH”. It was then moved by Shippen, seconded by Ewart, that the ordinance pass its first reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was then moved by Coy, seconded by Ewart, that the rule of law requiring an ordinance be read at three separate meetings of the Council be suspended and the Ordinance placed on second reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The necessary three-fourths having voted to suspend the rules, the Ordinance was read for the second time, after which it was moved by Shippen, seconded by Driscoll, that the Ordinance pass its second reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was then moved by Schwarz, seconded by Ewart, that the rule of the law requiring an ordinance be read at three separate meetings of the Council be suspended and the Ordinance placed on third reading. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The necessary three-fourths having voted to suspend the rules, the Ordinance was read for the third time, after which it was moved by Shippen, seconded by Ewart, that the Ordinance pass its third reading and be finally passed, adopted and approved. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The Ordinance was then numbered No. 436 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Idaho Falls Post, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls, and having a general circulation therein.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Shippen, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
