FEBRUARY 1, 1929

A communication from the Municipal Officers Association was read and referred to the Finance Committee.

A communication from the Idaho Falls Chamber of Commerce was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Ewart, that the City Engineer be authorized to represent the City at the Annual Meeting for the election of a water master for 1929 in Water District No. 36, to be held at the Court House, Idaho Falls, Idaho, Monday, March 4, 1929. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following report was read:

We, your Electric Light & Water Committee recommend at this time to dispense with one of our Engineers, for the reason that we believe one man can handle the situation now. We might also call your attention to the fact that the Engineering Fund is getting low and unnecessary expenses for the Extension Fund ought to be stopped.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Driscoll, that the above report be adopted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The Mayor announced that he had appointed Dr. R. J. Sutton as City Physician to fill out the unexpired term of Dr. T. C. Hollister, deceased.

It was moved by Shippen, seconded by Shattuck, that the above appointment be confirmed. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time Councilman Shippen was excused from further participation of the proceedings of the Council.

After considerable discussion, it was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Driscoll, that all delinquent licenses be collected from January 1, 1927, down to date. Roll call voting aye; Shattuck, Coy, Driscoll and Holmes, passing; Ewart, absent and not voting; Randall, Schwarz and Shippen, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

FEBRUARY 1, 1929

It was moved by Coy, seconded by Shattuck, that all men employed on street work be paid at the rate of 40 cents per hour for single hands and 70 cents per hour for man and team. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Ewart, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
