

JANUARY 18, 1929

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The City Council met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 8:00 p.m.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, E. R. Underhill, City Clerk, and Councilmen Schwarz, Shattuck, Coy, Driscoll, Ewart and Holmes, absent; Randall and Shippen, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Finance Committee presented the following claims which had been checked by the Purchasing Agent and OK'd by them and recommended that the same be allowed:

It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Ewart, that the above claims be allowed and warrants ordered drawn in payment of same on the proper funds. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

A communication from C. T. Edwards was read and referred to the Light & Water Committee.

A communication from Stephenson Brothers requesting extension for the completion of their contract until April 1, 1929, was read, and the same having been approved by the Light & Water Committee, it was moved by Holmes, seconded by Driscoll, that the extension be granted as requested. Roll call voting aye; Holmes, Schwarz, Shattuck, Coy and Driscoll, voting nay; Ewart, absent and not voting; Randall and Shippen, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

A communication from George W. Edgington asking for a \$1,000.00 fee in the case of the East Idaho Gas Company vs City of Idaho Falls was read and referred to the Finance Committee.

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C. R. Black presented a report on the concrete work of the new Power Dam which was referred to the Light & Water and Finance Committees.

Mr. Albaugh reported that the case in the Justice Court of Alvin Denman, Receiver, vs City of Idaho Falls has been decided in favor of the City. Mr. Albaugh also brought up the matter of the so-called Airport Bill now before the Legislature, and suggested that a request be made to have cities of the second-class included under the provisions of the bill.

The following resolution was then presented:

RESOLUTION

“WHEREAS, there has been introduced in the present session of the Legislature of the State of Idaho a bill to allow cities of the first-class to acquire, own and operate Airports or Aeroplane landing fields, and

WHEREAS, it is considered advisable by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho to have such bill enlarged in scope so as to include cities of the second-class;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho that the Legislature of the State of Idaho be requested and petitioned to pass the above named bill with an amendment extending privileges of the same to all cities of the second-class within the State.”

It was moved by Schwarz, seconded by Ewart, that the above resolution be adopted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Schwarz, that all places of business delinquent and refusing to pay licenses shall be closed within ten (10) days and the Chief of Police be ordered to enforce the same. Roll call voting aye; Schwarz, Shattuck, Coy, Ewart and Holmes, voting nay; Driscoll, absent and not voting; Randall and Shippen, whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Schwarz, that the Sanitary Inspector be ordered to enforce the provisions of the Milk Ordinance. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

Mr. Christensen reported progress in the negotiations with the Railroad Company for the improving of the D Street Subway.

It was moved by Ewart, seconded by Shattuck, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
