It was moved by Shippen, seconded by Ewart, that the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and warrants ordered drawn on the proper funds in payment of the above claims. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The following reports were read and ordered filed:

The application of H. R. DeVore for building permit for residence on Lots 27 and 28 of Block 47, Crows, was presented, and the same having been approved by the Building Inspector, it was moved by Shippen, seconded by Driscoll, that the permit be granted. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

At this time an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, SHALL BE REQUIRED TO TAKE POSSESSION OF AND HOLD PERSONAL PROPERTY UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS AND TO KEEP A RECORD OF THE SAME; TO ADVERTISE AND SELL THE SAID PERSONAL PROPERTY AND TO TURN THE RECEIPTS FROM SUCH SALES INTO THE GENERAL FUND; ALSO PROVIDING FOR REIMBURSEMENT TO THE OWNER OF ANY PERSONAL PROPERTY UNDER THE TERMS OF THIS ORDINANCE" came up for passage on the third reading, and after the same had been read in full by the Clerk, it was moved by Randall, seconded by Holmes, that the ordinance pass its third read and be finally passed, adopted and approved. Roll call voting aye; Randall, Holmes, Shattuck, Shippen, Coy, Driscoll and Ewart, voting nay; none, absent and not voting; Schwarz, whereupon the President of the Council declared the motion carried and the ordinance duly passed. The said ordinance was then numbered #435 and passed to the President of the Council for his approval, and was by him duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Idaho Falls Post, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

The Fire Chief brought up the matter of purchasing a motor-generator battery charger which is offered for sale by L. M. Miller at the price of \$45.00. It was moved by Shippen, seconded by Coy, that the same be purchased. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

Mr. Kirksey took up with the Council the matter of having had one or more teams on the island at the new power plant from November 11 to December 1st without work. After discussion, it was moved by Shippen, seconded by Ewart, that this matter be referred to Mr. Black and the Finance Committee. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

The City Engineer reported that the well on the corner of I and Jefferson is now down to a depth of approximately 150 feet, and that considerable water is in the hole but that no analysis has yet been made as to quality and hardness nor had it been determined as to the amount of flow.

It was moved by Shippen, seconded by Driscoll, that the Building Committee and Purchasing Agent be authorized to purchase the necessary steel for the new Fire Station at the corner of C and Shoup Avenue. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

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It was moved by Shippen, seconded by Ewart, that the City Attorney and City Engineer be authorized to negotiate with the Oregon Short Line Railroad Company for the sidening and improving of the subway. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

It was moved by Shippen, seconded by Ewart, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
