Public Works requests authorization to prepare the design of 25th Street Improvements located between Woodruff Avenue and St. Clair Road, including the Moody Canal crossing.

Councilmember Erickson addressed the City Council, beginning with the budget hearing process, at which Capital Improvement Projects were discussed. He explained further that the City of Idaho Falls was to receive \$400,000.00 from the State of Idaho for roadway improvements, but only received \$275,000.00 at this time, due to the flood conditions in northern Idaho. Each year following, the City will receive \$400,000.00. Mr. Erickson explained further that Sunnyside Road would not be able to be designed and completed for several years. Following a Work Session among City Councilmembers, it was agreed that 25th Street, from St. Clair Road to Woodruff Avenue, would be a project to be reviewed. He stated that Mayor Milam wanted Holmes Avenue, between Seventeenth Street and Sunnyside Road to be improved. Councilmember Erickson further stated that the City Council has been judicious in receiving all comments regarding this improvement. The improvements to 25th Street have been approved by three Administrations, various Planning Commissions and Staff for more than thirty years. He stated that he has reviewed Planning Commission Minutes and Council Meeting Minutes (copies of which were provided to each

Councilmember) from as early as 1958, showing no opposition from any Councilmember to complete this project. Councilmember Erickson explained that the development of 25th Street has been committed and \$316,000.00 has been spent by the City of Idaho Falls to date for that development (\$12,800.00 for Landscaping, \$47,600.00 for Engineering, and \$254,500.00 for Street Work). He explained that the last article in The Post Register regarding this issue was a threat to the City Council, in which it stated "The group has not yet decided what it's next step will be, if the Council approves the entire project. Hiring an attorney to fight it, is one possibility." said Dave Peters."

It was moved by Councilmember Erickson, seconded by Councilmember Mills, to give authorization for the Public Works Division to prepare the design of 25th Street Improvements located between Woodruff Avenue and St. Clair Road, including the Moody Canal crossing.

Councilmember Hardcastle stated that the issue is not "whether" 25th Street should be completed as a collector street by bridging the Moody Canal, but rather "when" it should be completed. She stated that the City has a limited amount of money and a long list of projects. Councilmember Hardcastle stated that it will cost approximately \$1.3 Million to complete Sunnyside Road. She places a very high priority on improving Holmes Avenue, from 17th Street to Sunnyside Road, to a four-lane road. When the west extension of 25th Street (by Community Park) is completed, more pressure will be placed on Holmes Avenue. She explained further that the west extension of 25th Street will be completed when Gary Voigt reaches that point in his development of the remainder of the Cedar Ridge Addition (which time is unknown at this point). Councilmember Hardcastle stated that she believes that it would be foolish to bridge the Moody Canal before the west extension of 25th Street is completed. She commented further that the City Council's most important obligation is to spend the City's tax dollars responsibly. Decisions should be based on objective studies of the factors involved in each project, such as safety, the number of people served, and other relevant criteria. Further, she believes that past administrations have made a good faith effort to soften the impact of 25th Street as a collector street, by investing the tax dollars in an attractive, landscaped median. This project should be completed as planned. However, in relation to other problem areas that need to be addressed, she does not believe that bridging the Moody Canal, at this time, ranks as high on the list of priorities as other projects. Councilmember Hardcastle stated that if the Council voted to complete the bridge over Moody Canal, she would stand in support of that decision.

Councilmember Mills explained that during his five years on the City Council, he has observed group after group of neighbors addressing the Traffic Safety Committee with their neighborhood traffic problems. On most occasions, these citizens have been sent out the door with a promise of additional police enforcement and speed limit signs. Speed limit signs and stop signs rarely make an impact. He stated further that the City does not have the resources to place an officer on every block. Councilmember Mills stated that in the Mayoral race of 1989, citizens responded by saying that the streets in this City were in need of repair. During the past five years, a program to asphalt overlay arterial streets was implemented and has been effective in preserving and improving major city streets. He challenged the Council, as the budget process begins again, to develop a form of funding enhancements and calming devices to residential streets, like or similar to what has been shared with the Council by the 25th Street group. He would like to see the program work as the curb and gutter replacement program has worked, with citizen participation. He wanted the Engineering Department to develop a set of approved standards as an additional element of this residential street enhancement program, based on the classification of the street. Councilmember Mills then reviewed negative comments that he has received with regard to the 25th Street improvement issue. He further expressed that there is a great deal of time spent by City Councilmembers on behalf of the citizens of this City, which requires a deep devotion to the community. Every decision made by the Council is taken seriously.

Councilmember Carlson stated that he has been on the City Council for five years. This has been one of the toughest decisions that he has made. He commented further that he hated seeing neighbors against neighbors, streets against streets, and subdivisions against subdivisions. This issue has come to that. The City Council has worked a lot of long, hard hours on this issue.

Mayor Milam stated that this issue has been front-page for approximately 6 months. Comments have been received at Council Meetings during that time, formal and informal studies have been conducted, and a Work Session has been conducted specifically for this issue. Mayor Milam stated further that the Council will take comment from the public at this time.

Richard Kenney, 2830 Galway Court, appeared to state that the Comprehensive Plan has merit and needs to be followed. Over the years, the Comprehensive Plan has designated 25th Street to be a collector street. He stated further, that the development of infrastructure is important and that no more building permits should be issued in the Cedar Ridge Addition or the Jennie Lee Addition, until that infrastructure is complete. Mr. Kenney stated that more than 200 homes are on residential streets that are now acting as collector streets, because 25th Street is not complete. Due to the fact that more than \$300,000.00 have been spent on 25th Street, it needs to be completed now.

Mark McAlister, 1867 West 25th Street, appeared to state that everyone needs to have a sense of pride and livability in their neighborhoods. He expressed his concern over the Planning Commission Meeting that would address a rezone from R-3 to C-1 in order for Home Depot to go in generally behind Albertson's and Sam's Club on Seventeenth Street. Dr. McAlister stated that this would further increase the traffic on 25th Street. He was concerned about the number of traffic accidents on 25th Street and Channing Way, and also along the Community Park. Dr. McAlister stated that the Moody Canal diversion is the only opportunity that the neighborhood has to slow the traffic down. He further reviewed for Council the results of the ITE traffic study that was conducted for the 25th Street residents. Dr. McAlister requested the City Council to defeat the motion to bridge the Moody Canal.

Paula Krantz, 1559 Delmar Circle, appeared to state that she had the unfortunate experience of finding her child lying on the side of the road on Coronado, thinking that he had been hit by a car. She fears for the safety of the children in her neighborhood. This area has increased in traffic. With growth, more people are expected. The people in this neighborhood chose to purchase homes there, because they enjoy living on the east side of town. They will accept the increased traffic in these areas, but it is only fair to share the traffic with the whole neighborhood. Mrs. Krantz stated that whatever the decision, it needed to be safe and equitable for everyone.

Kristy Romero, 1929 East 25th Street, appeared in opposition of bridging the Moody Canal. As she wanted to make up her own mind, she and her husband conducted numerous traffic counts in her neighborhood. She reviewed for Council those numbers. Mrs. Romero stated that there are some Councilmembers who want to spent tax monies to get rid of a natural barrier (Moody Canal Bridge) that will save 25th Street and the surrounding area from a major increase in traffic. She stated that there were several residents from the Rose Nielson Addition area who signed a petition in favor of the bridge over the Moody Canal. They felt that they had received misleading information, and have called to have their names removed from that petition. Mrs. Romero further stated that as she passed her petition, many people responded that they would rather have the money used on Sunnyside Road or on Holmes Avenue, but not to bridge the Moody Canal right now. She stated that she wanted Council to deny the request to bridge the Moody Canal.

C. E. White, Jr., 3280 Chapparral, appeared to state that last summer, the City Council voted unanimously to complete 25th Street, in connection with the budget. He commented further, that the budget to complete 25th Street can be met with this year's funds from the State of Idaho. Mr. White clarified that the Planning Commission will be considering the space for Home Depot to be on 21st Street, not on 25th Street. He stated

that the absence of a bridge over the Moody Canal is a great safety hazard for the children walking or riding their bikes. Mr. White wanted the Council to approve the design of the 25th Street Improvements, including the bridge over the Moody Canal.

David Peters, 1956 East 25th Street, appeared to state that traffic will continue to be a problem until a method is developed to build the arterial streets, and until through-traffic is eliminated from residential areas. He commented that the Council has the opportunity to take a step back, by not bridging the Moody Canal at this time, and develop and improve the major arterials. Mr. Peters reviewed for Council how his citizens' group was formed and their history thus far. He further wanted the Council to take one year to give this issue a further study before allowing it to come to the vote of the Council.

This office has received a request to issue a building permit for a new building to house the Home Oxygen and Medical Equipment facility. Our initial response, after examining the building plans and conversing with the applicant, was to deny the request. The property owners subsequently requested a ruling from the Mayor and City Council that this use would be permitted under Section 7-7-2.J. "...Other uses which have been ruled by the City Council to be similar..."

We have since met with the property owners, applicant, and City Attorney. The following proposal is being submitted for your consideration: If the business is conducted within the confines of the following description, it would qualify for the "similar use" provisions of Section 7-7-2.J of the Zoning Ordinance:

Professional offices for use by a licensed respiratory therapist, including instruction and training of patients in the use of therapeutic respiratory

equipment, and the demonstration, sale and rental of such equipment, provided the warehousing of equipment inventory and the delivery of such equipment to the patient occurs off-premises, except where immediate delivery is necessary for the health, safety, or welfare of the patient.

If the City Council approves this language, it will be included in the permit issued to the owners.

SETTING FORTH QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE

ISSUANCE OF SUCH LICENSES; ESTABLISHING
PROCEDURE FOR APPROVAL OF LICENSES;
REQUIRING POSTING OF A BOND AND
APPROPRIATE CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE;
ESTABLISHING LICENSE FEES AND PROCEDURES
FOR REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF LICENSES;
PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND
ESTABLISHING EFFECTIVE DATE.

Councilmember Hardcastle explained that this Ordinance has been developed over a period of 1-1/2 years.

Bill Toelke, Idaho Special Investigations, appeared to thank City Attorney Dale Storer for his good work in compiling this Ordinance. He stated that he has been the instigator of this Ordinance because Private Investigators need to be controlled in some manner.

Jim Clark, Clark Investigations, appeared to express his concern over the lack of communication between the author of the document and the people who will have to be licensed. He is concerned that other private investigators will not know about this licensing procedure.

The City Attorney explained that there is no requirement for advance notice before an Ordinance is considered. There is a requirement that the Ordinance be read on three separate occasions, allowing for public comment to an Ordinance.

A discussion followed regarding how Private Investigators can be notified regarding this Ordinance and, further, the regulatory nature of this Ordinance.
