

SEPTEMBER 9, 1993

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Council Meeting, Thursday, September 9, 1993, in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: Mayor ProTem Melvin L. Erickson; Councilmembers Larry Carlson, Joseph Groberg, Linda Milam, and Gary Mills; Absent: Councilmember Ralph Wood. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney; and all available Division Directors.

The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of a Regular Council Meeting held August 19, and a Special Council Meeting held August 24, 1993. The minutes of both meetings were approved.

The Chief of Police presented a Pedestrian Safety Citation Award from the American Automobile Association to the City Administration.

The Mayor ProTem declared open a public hearing as legally advertised, to consider an amended plat of Ski's Acres. He called upon Councilmember Mills to conduct the hearing. At the request of Councilmember Mills, the City Clerk read the following memo:

Attached is a copy of the Annexation Ordinance, Annexation Agreement, and Final Plat of Ski's Acres. This property is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Bellin and West Broadway. Division No. 1 of Ski's Acres was annexed to the City and zoned C-1 several years ago. The amended plat currently being presented provides for an additional strip of land on the south side of the existing plat, approximately 35 feet in depth. The Planning Commission recently considered this matter and at that time, recommended approval of the plat, annexation to the City, and initial zoning of C-1. This Department concurs with that recommendation. This matter is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for consideration.

The Director of Planning and Zoning located the subject area on a map on the wall and further explained the request.

No one appeared either for or against this request. The City Attorney read the following ordinance title:

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN LANDS TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; DESCRIBING SAID LANDS AND DECLARING SAME A PART OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO. (SKI'S ACRES ADDITION, DIVISION NO. 1)

The foregoing ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilmember Mills, seconded by Groberg, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully read on three several days be dispensed with, the question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-902 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE FULLY READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmembers Erickson, Mills, Groberg, Milam, and Carlson; No, none; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmembers Carlson, Milam, Groberg, Mills, and Erickson; No, none; carried.

The Mayor ProTem declared open a public hearing to consider the initial zoning of the newly annexed area. No one appeared. It was moved by Councilmember Mills, seconded by Groberg, that the initial zoning of Ski's Acres be established as C-1 and that the comprehensive plan be amended to include the area annexed herewith, and that the City Planner be instructed to reflect said annexation, zoning, and amendment to the comprehensive plan on the comprehensive plan and zoning maps located in his office. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmembers Milam, Carlson, Mills, Erickson, and Groberg; No, none; carried.

The Mayor declared open a public hearing, as provided for by ordinance, to consider the exchange of certain real property known as Sandy Downs Rodeo Arena, for certain other real property owned by Bonneville County and known as the Bonneville County Fairgrounds. He invited comment from the floor.

Mr. Rue Stears, 1235 Bannock, appeared to ask if appraisals have been made, and if the exchange included the buildings and facilities. Councilmembers explained that the exchange has been made for administrative purposes, not value, and that the Agreement includes joint use provisions until facilities can be constructed at both locations. It was moved by Councilmember Milam, seconded by Mills, that the City Attorney be authorized to prepare the necessary Exchange Agreement. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmembers Mills, Erickson, Carlson, Groberg, and Milam; No, none; carried.

On August 24, 1993, bids were received and opened on the Lomax Street and Lee Avenue Water Line Replacements as budgeted in the current budget. The low bid was provided by H-K Contractors, Inc., as follows:

Base Bid	\$154,581.00
Alternate No. 1	\$150,827.50
Alternate No. 2	\$202,530.40

The two (2) Alternates each provided for a different method by which the street was to be rehabilitated following the installation of the water line. Alternate No. 1 essentially required repair of the water line trench and application of a two-inch asphalt plant mix over the entire street width (excluding curb and gutter). Alternate No. 2, however, required a reconstruction of the entire street width which included new aggregate base material, geotextile fabric and four-inch asphalt plant mix (excluding curb and gutter).

Considering the volume of traffic on Lomax Street and value of the added construction provided in Alternate No. 2, Public Works recommends acceptance of the low base bid and Alternate No. 2 of H-K Contractors, Inc., in the lump sum amount of \$357,111.40 and authorization for the Mayor to sign the necessary documents.

The City Clerk also shall publish the sample ballot in at least two issues of the POST REGISTER, a newspaper printed and published in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho. The last publication to be written 5 days previous of the election. The form of the sample ballot shall be as prescribed in Idaho Code 50-440.
